abdominal	An abdominal muscle. <i>Pilates greatly benefits the lower abdominals.</i>
adipose	Composed of animal fat. <i>Adipose tissue constitutes the fat of meat.</i>
belly	A pig s belly as food especially as a traded commodity. <i>In the belly of the ship.</i>
bony	Composed of or containing bone. <i>The bony plates that protect turtles and tortoises.</i>
bowel	The part of the alimentary canal below the stomach; the intestine. <i>He felt his bowels loosen.</i>
chest	Propel the ball by means of one s chest. <i>An oak chest.</i>
chubby	Sufficiently fat so as to have a pleasing fullness of figure. <i>A pretty child with chubby cheeks.</i>
digestion	The process of treating a substance with heat, enzymes, or a solvent to promote decomposition or extract essential components. <i>He suffered with his digestion.</i>
fat	A kind of body tissue containing stored fat that serves as a source of energy it also cushions and insulates vital organs. <i>Sizzling fat.</i>
fatty	(of a disease or lesion) marked by abnormal deposition of fat in cells. <i>A stranger called him a fatty.</i>
gastrointestinal	Of or relating to the stomach and intestines. <i>Ginger soothes the gastrointestinal tract.</i>
gut	Remove the guts of. <i>What s the matter with you misery guts.</i>

hip	A person's hip joint. <i>I have big hips and thighs.</i>
liver	An organ similar to the liver in other animals. Liver coloured lesions.
lung	Each of the pair of organs situated within the ribcage, consisting of elastic sacs with branching passages into which air is drawn, so that oxygen can pass into the blood and carbon dioxide be removed. Lungs are characteristic of vertebrates other than fish, though similar structures are present in some other animal groups. <i>The city had to be given lungs in the shape of open spaces squares parks and gardens.</i>
obese	Excessively fat. <i>One in ten people surveyed were obese.</i>
organs	Edible viscera of a butchered animal.
osseous	Composed of or containing bone. Osseous tissue.
overweight	Usually describes a large person who is fat but has a large frame to carry it. <i>An overweighted boat paddled by clumsy oarsmen.</i>
paunch	A protruding abdomen. <i>His body was powerful and square with the beginnings of a paunch.</i>
paunchy	Having a large belly. <i>A slightly paunchy balding middle aged man.</i>
physical	Impelled by physical force especially against resistance. <i>The physical size of a computer.</i>
plump	Make fat or plump. <i>She wore an outfit she'd always wanted to try but felt she was too plump to risk.</i>
portly	Of a stately or dignified appearance and manner. <i>A portly little man with a bowler hat.</i>
pudgy	(of a person or part of their body) rather fat. <i>His pudgy fingers.</i>
tendinous	Consisting of tendons or resembling a tendon. <i>The tendinous portion of the hamstring.</i>
tissue	Tissue paper. Tissue textiles.
ventral	On or relating to the underside of an animal or plant; abdominal. <i>The liver is somewhat ventral in position.</i>

waist

The part of a garment around or covering the waist.
*Her **waist** has reduced from 35 to 28 inches.*
