Definitions of "Bombard" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "bombard" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Attack (a place or person) continuously with bombs, shells, or other missiles.*
- *Direct a stream of high-speed particles at (a substance).*
- *Subject (someone) to a continuous flow of questions, criticisms, or information.*
- *Cast, hurl, or throw repeatedly with some missile.*
- *Direct high energy particles or radiation against.*
- *Address with continuously or persistently, as if with a barrage.*
- *Throw bombs at or attack with bombs.*



Synonyms of "Bombard" as a verb (16 Words)

barrage	Address with continuously or persistently as if with a barrage. <i>The speaker was barraged by an angry audience.</i>
blitz	Attack or seriously damage a place in a blitz. <i>She blitzed her own world record in the 400m freestyle.</i>
bomb	Attack a place or object with a bomb or bombs. <i>They bombed the city at dawn.</i>
deluge	Fill quickly beyond capacity; as with a liquid. <i>Caravans were deluged by the heavy rains.</i>
fire at	Cause to go off.
fire on	Bake in a kiln so as to harden.
flood	Cover or submerge an area with water in a flood. <i>The swollen river flooded the village.</i>

inundate	Overwhelm (someone) with things or people to be dealt with. <i>We ve been inundated with complaints from listeners.</i>
pelt	Cast, hurl, or throw repeatedly with some missile. <i>Two boys pelted him with rotten apples.</i>
pepper	Add pepper to. <i>His car was peppered with bullets.</i>
pound	Place or shut up in a pound. <i>Pound the cows so they don t stray.</i>
shell	Look for and collect shells by the seashore. <i>He shelled the pitcher for eight runs in the first inning.</i>
snow under	Conceal one's true motives from especially by elaborately feigning good intentions so as to gain an end.
strafe	Attack repeatedly with bombs or machine-gun fire from low-flying aircraft. <i>Military aircraft strafed the village.</i>
swamp	Overwhelm with an excessive amount of something; inundate. <i>A huge wave swamped the canoes.</i>
torpedo	Attack or sink a ship with a torpedo or torpedoes. <i>Fighting between the militias torpedoed peace talks.</i>



Usage Examples of "Bombard" as a verb

- *They will be bombarded with complaints.*
- *The city was bombarded by federal forces.*
- *The governor was bombarded with requests to grant a pardon to the convicted killer.*



Associations of "Bombard" (30 Words)

arm

The part of an armchair or sofa that supports the elbow and forearm of a seated person.

*The **arm** of the record player.*

artillery

An army unit that uses big guns.

*Tanks and heavy **artillery**.*

assail

Attack in speech or writing.

*He **assailed** a group of editors for their alleged excesses.*

blast

An explosion (as of dynamite).

*Fowler was **blasted** with an air rifle.*

bomb

Attack a place or object with a bomb or bombs.

*A **bomb** attack.*

bombardier

A rank of non-commissioned officer in certain artillery regiments, equivalent to corporal.

bomber	A bomber jacket. <i>Manny hand rolled a couple of bombers.</i>
burst	Burst outward usually with noise. <i>The mortar bursts were further away than before.</i>
cannon	Make a cannon shot. <i>The gunships blasted arms depots with 105 mm cannon fire and rockets.</i>
detonate	Explode or cause to explode. <i>Two other bombs failed to detonate.</i>
detonation	The action of causing a bomb or explosive device to explode. <i>She was in a control building at the time of detonation.</i>
<u>explode</u>	Drive from the stage by noisy disapproval. <i>The enemy exploded the bridge.</i>
<u>explosion</u>	The noise caused by an explosion. <i>An explosion of rage.</i>
explosive	(of a vocal sound) produced with a sharp release of air. <i>An explosive issue.</i>
fighter	A person who does not easily admit defeat in spite of difficulties or opposition. <i>There ll be months of physiotherapy but medical staff say she s a fighter.</i>
firing	The act of firing weapons or artillery at an enemy. <i>The colours had suffered in the firing and were dull from overheating.</i>
flak	Strong criticism. <i>He has been getting flak from certain quarters lately for pointing this out.</i>
<u>gun</u>	A person who shoots a gun as regards their ability. <i>The boom of the one o clock gun echoed across the river.</i>
gunner	(in the British army) an artillery soldier (used especially as an official term for a private).
implode	Collapse or cause to collapse violently inwards. <i>The bottle imploded.</i>
missile	An object which is forcibly propelled at a target, either by hand or from a mechanical weapon. <i>One of the players was hit on the head by a missile thrown by a spectator.</i>
musket	A muzzle-loading shoulder gun with a long barrel; formerly used by infantrymen. <i>A volley of musket fire.</i>

nuclear	Denoting relating to or powered by the energy released in nuclear fission or fusion. <i>Nuclear weapons.</i>
ordnance	A branch of government service dealing especially with military stores and materials. <i>The ordnance corps.</i>
rifle	Troops armed with rifles. <i>There are four basic ways to rifle a gun barrel.</i>
salvo	A sudden, vigorous, or aggressive act or series of acts. <i>There was a salvo of approval.</i>
shot	Sports equipment consisting of a heavy metal ball used in the shot put. <i>Paul tried one last shot You realize what you want will cost more money.</i>
<u>tank</u>	Treat in a tank. <i>The trucks all had a full tank of gasoline.</i>
<u>war</u>	A legal state created by a declaration of war and ended by official declaration during which the international rules of war apply. <i>Small states warred against each another.</i>
<u>weapon</u>	Any instrument or instrumentality used in fighting or hunting. <i>He used all his conversational weapons.</i>
