arm	A thing comparable to an arm in form or function typically something that projects from a larger structure. <i>They have extended the arm of friendship to developing countries.</i>
artillery	Large-calibre guns used in warfare on land. <i>Each corps included two regiments of field artillery.</i>
assail	Make a concerted or violent attack on. <i>Nightmares assailed him regularly.</i>
blast	Move very quickly and loudly in a specified direction. <i>Four low flying jets blasted down the glen.</i>
bomb	Attack a place or object with a bomb or bombs. <i>The Americans bombed Dresden.</i>
bombardier	A noncommissioned officer in the British artillery.
bomber	A bomber jacket. <i>Manny hand rolled a couple of bombers.</i>
burst	The act of exploding or bursting. <i>The sun burst into view.</i>
cannon	Make a cannon shot. <i>They would cross at the Town ford under cover of the defending cannon.</i>
detonate	Explode or cause to explode. <i>The bomb detonated at noon.</i>
detonation	The action of causing a bomb or explosive device to explode. <i>Natural gas s high resistance to detonation.</i>
explode	Drive from the stage by noisy disapproval. <i>This is ludicrous she exploded.</i>
explosion	The noise caused by an explosion. <i>There will have to be sweeping changes if the political leaders want to avoid an explosion.</i>

explosive	Serving to explode or characterized by explosion or sudden outburst. <i>Explosive gas.</i>
fighter	A person or animal that fights. <i>The distinction between civilian populations and fighters.</i>
firing	The act of firing weapons or artillery at an enemy. <i>A series of firings and resignations.</i>
flak	Anti-aircraft fire. <i>You must be strong enough to take the flak if things go wrong.</i>
gun	Shoot with a gun. <i>A grease gun.</i>
gunner	A member of the armed forces who operates or specializes in guns.
implode	End or fail suddenly or dramatically. <i>He lost money when the market imploded.</i>
missile	A weapon that is self-propelled or directed by remote control, carrying conventional or nuclear explosive. <i>The plane disintegrated after being hit by a missile launched from the ground.</i>
musket	An infantryman's light gun with a long barrel, typically smooth-bored and fired from the shoulder. <i>A volley of musket fire.</i>
nuclear	Denoting relating to or powered by the energy released in nuclear fission or fusion. <i>Nuclear physics.</i>
ordnance	Munitions. <i>The ordnance corps.</i>
rifle	A shoulder firearm with a long barrel and a rifled bore. <i>Ferguson rifled home his fourth goal of the season.</i>
salvo	A sudden, vigorous, or aggressive act or series of acts. <i>The pardons provoked a salvo of accusations.</i>
shot	A ball of stone or metal used as a missile shot from a large gun or cannon. <i>The nurse gave him a flu shot.</i>
tank	Treat in a tank. <i>Tank animal refuse.</i>
war	Make or wage war. <i>A price war among tour operators.</i>
weapon	Any instrument or instrumentality used in fighting or hunting. <i>Resignation threats had long been a weapon in his armoury.</i>
