<b>directory</b>	A book of directions for the conduct of Christian worship, especially in Presbyterian and Roman Catholic Churches.
<b>file</b>	File a formal charge against. <i>The company had <b>filed</b> for bankruptcy.</i>
<b>folder</b>	A folded leaflet or a booklet made of folded sheets of paper.
<b>guiding</b>	Showing the way by conducting or leading; imposing direction on. <i>A <b>guiding</b> principle.</i>
<b>handbook</b>	A book giving information such as facts on a particular subject or instructions for operating a machine. <i>The <b>handbook</b> says an alkaline battery should be good for around 2000 hours of continuous performance.</i>
<b>index</b>	Provide an index to. <i>The list <b>indexes</b> theses under regional headings.</i>
<b>indicant</b>	A thing which indicates something. <i>Symptoms are the prime <b>indicants</b> of disease.</i>
<b>indication</b>	A datum about some physical state that is presented to a user by a meter or similar instrument. <i>The presence of bacterial infection was an <b>indication</b> for the use of antibiotics.</i>
<b>label</b>	Attach a tag or label to. <i>Insulin <b>labelled</b> with iodine 125 was used as a tracer.</i>
<b>leaflet</b>	Distribute leaflets to people or an area. <i>Tourists visiting the area are being <b>leafleted</b>.</i>
<b>list</b>	A formal structure analogous to a list by which items of data can be stored or processed in a definite order. <i>The ship <b>listed</b> to starboard.</i>
<b>listing</b>	An entry in a list or register.
<b>mark</b>	Make small marks into the surface of. <i>I did well at <b>marking</b> the ball.</i>
<b>note</b>	A written sign representing the pitch and duration of a musical note. <i>A credit <b>note</b>.</i>
<b>page</b>	Move through and display text one page at a time. <i>He was turning the <b>pages</b> of his Sunday newspaper.</i>
<b>pamphlet</b>	Distribute pamphlets to. <i>A handful of heritage minded citizens who <b>pamphleted</b> their neighbours.</i>
<b>punctuate</b>	Insert punctuation marks into. <i>They should be shown how to set out and <b>punctuate</b> direct speech.</i>

**punctuation** Rapid or sudden speciation, as suggested by the theory of punctuated equilibrium.

*You will notice that no **punctuation** is used.*

**register** Entrust a letter or parcel to a post office for transmission by registered post.  
*At the store's bridal registry single people can **register** for gifts even if they are not getting married.*

**signpost** Indicate a place with a signpost.  
*Most of the walks were well **signposted**.*

**tab** The key on a typewriter or a word processor that causes a tabulation.  
*The collar has a **tab** with a button hole.*

**tabloid** Sensationalist journalism.  
*A **tabloid** TV show.*

**tag** Attach a monitoring tag to.  
*I will be **tagged** in every photo I post.*

**ticket** Provide with a ticket for passage or admission.  
*The sports jacket had been **ticketed** at two hundred dollars.*
