directory	A book of directions for the conduct of Christian worship, especially in Presbyterian and Roman Catholic Churches.
file	File a formal charge against. <i>The company had filed for bankruptcy.</i>
folder	A folded leaflet or a booklet made of folded sheets of paper.
guiding	Showing the way by conducting or leading; imposing direction on. <i>A guiding principle.</i>
handbook	A book giving information such as facts on a particular subject or instructions for operating a machine. <i>The handbook says an alkaline battery should be good for around 2000 hours of continuous performance.</i>
index	Provide an index to. <i>The list indexes theses under regional headings.</i>
indicant	A thing which indicates something. <i>Symptoms are the prime indicants of disease.</i>
indication	A datum about some physical state that is presented to a user by a meter or similar instrument. <i>The presence of bacterial infection was an indication for the use of antibiotics.</i>
label	Attach a tag or label to. <i>Insulin labelled with iodine 125 was used as a tracer.</i>
leaflet	Distribute leaflets to people or an area. <i>Tourists visiting the area are being leafleted.</i>
list	A formal structure analogous to a list by which items of data can be stored or processed in a definite order. <i>The ship listed to starboard.</i>
listing	An entry in a list or register.
mark	Make small marks into the surface of. <i>I did well at marking the ball.</i>
note	A written sign representing the pitch and duration of a musical note. <i>A credit note.</i>
page	Move through and display text one page at a time. <i>He was turning the pages of his Sunday newspaper.</i>
pamphlet	Distribute pamphlets to. <i>A handful of heritage minded citizens who pamphleted their neighbours.</i>
punctuate	Insert punctuation marks into. <i>They should be shown how to set out and punctuate direct speech.</i>

punctuation Rapid or sudden speciation, as suggested by the theory of punctuated equilibrium.

*You will notice that no **punctuation** is used.*

register Entrust a letter or parcel to a post office for transmission by registered post.
*At the store's bridal registry single people can **register** for gifts even if they are not getting married.*

signpost Indicate a place with a signpost.
*Most of the walks were well **signposted**.*

tab The key on a typewriter or a word processor that causes a tabulation.
*The collar has a **tab** with a button hole.*

tabloid Sensationalist journalism.
*A **tabloid** TV show.*

tag Attach a monitoring tag to.
*I will be **tagged** in every photo I post.*

ticket Provide with a ticket for passage or admission.
*The sports jacket had been **ticketed** at two hundred dollars.*
