### **Definitions of "Booming" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “booming” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Struck with great force.*
- *Very lively and profitable.*
- *(of a sound or voice) loud, deep, and resonant.*
- *Used of the voice.*
- *Having a period of great prosperity or rapid economic growth.*
- *(used of the voice or sound) deep and resonant.*



<b>resounding</b>	Unmistakable; emphatic. <i>A <b>resounding</b> smack across the face.</i>
<b>reverberant</b>	Characterized by reverberation. <i>A <b>reverberant</b> room.</i>
<b>reverberating</b>	Characterized by resonance.
<b>reverberative</b>	Characterized by resonance.
<b>ringing</b>	Having or emitting a clear resonant sound. <i>A <b>ringing</b> voice.</i>
<b>roaring</b>	Making or uttering a roar. <i>A <b>roaring</b> boy.</i>
<b>rumbling</b>	Continuous full and low-pitched throbbing sound. <i>A <b>rumbling</b> dispute about changes to working conditions.</i>
<b>sonorous</b>	Full and loud and deep. <i>He read aloud with a <b>sonorous</b> and musical voice.</i>
<b>stentorian</b>	Used of the voice. <i>A <b>stentorian</b> roar.</i>
<b>strong</b>	Relating to or denoting the strongest of the known kinds of force between particles which acts between nucleons and other hadrons when closer than about 10 cm so binding protons in a nucleus despite the repulsion due to their charge and which conserves strangeness parity and isospin. <i>There is a <b>strong</b> argument for decentralization.</i>
<b>successful</b>	Having succeeded or being marked by a favorable outcome. <i>A <b>successful</b> business venture.</i>
<b>thriving</b>	Prosperous and growing; flourishing. <i>The <b>thriving</b> business George has built up.</i>
<b>thundering</b>	Extremely great, severe, or impressive. <i>A <b>thundering</b> bore.</i>
<b>thunderous</b>	Extremely ominous. <i>No goalkeeper cares to face his <b>thunderous</b> shots.</i>
<b>vigorous</b>	Characterized by or involving physical strength, effort, or energy. <i>A <b>vigorous</b> denial.</i>

<b>affluent</b>	An affluent person a person who is financially well off. <i>The <b>affluent</b> societies of the western world.</i>
<b>boom</b>	The characteristic resonant cry of the bittern. <i>Business is <b>booming</b>.</i>
<b>flourish</b>	(of a living organism) grow or develop in a healthy or vigorous way, especially as the result of a particularly congenial environment. <i>He entered to a <b>flourish</b> of trumpets.</i>

<b>grand</b>	A grand piano. <i>We had a <b>grand</b> day.</i>
<b>luxuriant</b>	(of hair) thick and healthy. <i>Forests of dark <b>luxuriant</b> foliage.</i>
<b>luxury</b>	Luxurious or of the nature of a luxury. <i>A <b>luxury</b> yacht.</i>
<b>metropolis</b>	A large and densely populated urban area; may include several independent administrative districts. <i>He preferred the peaceful life of the countryside to the bustle of the <b>metropolis</b>.</i>
<b>opulence</b>	Wealth as evidenced by sumptuous living. <i>Rooms of spectacular <b>opulence</b>.</i>
<b>opulent</b>	Wealthy. <i>His more <b>opulent</b> tenants.</i>
<b>palmy</b>	(especially of a previous period) flourishing or successful. <i>The <b>palmy</b> days of the 1970s.</i>
<b>plenitude</b>	An abundance. <i>The <b>plenitude</b> of the Pope's powers.</i>
<b>plenteous</b>	Affording an abundant supply. <i>A <b>plenteous</b> grape harvest.</i>
<b>plentitude</b>	A full supply.
<b>profusion</b>	An abundance or large quantity of something. <i>The <b>profusion</b> of detail.</i>
<b>prosper</b>	Make steady progress; be at the high point in one's career or reach a high point in historical significance or importance. <i>God has wonderfully <b>prospered</b> this nation.</i>
<b>prosperity</b>	An economic state of growth with rising profits and full employment. <i>A long period of peace and <b>prosperity</b>.</i>
<b>prosperous</b>	Marked by peace and prosperity. <i>We wish you a Merry Christmas and a <b>prosperous</b> New Year.</i>
<b>rich</b>	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i>These comments are a bit <b>rich</b> coming from a woman with no money worries.</i>
<b>richness</b>	A strong deep vividness of hue. <i>All are amazed at the <b>richness</b> of the colours.</i>
<b>successful</b>	Having succeeded or being marked by a favorable outcome. <i>A <b>successful</b> actor.</i>
