accompany	Play a musical accompaniment for. <i>The two sisters were to accompany us to London.</i>
acquaintance	Acquaintances considered collectively. <i>I have trouble remembering the names of all my acquaintances.</i>
beau	A rich, fashionable young man; a dandy. A male person who is a fellow member (of a fraternity or religion or other group).
brother	<i>The time is coming brothers for us to act.</i>

camaraderie	Mutual trust and friendship among people who spend a lot of time together. <i>The enforced camaraderie of office life.</i>

companionship	A feeling of fellowship or friendship. <i>The love and companionship of marriage.</i>
compatriot	A person from your own country. <i>Stich defeated his compatriot Boris Becker in the quarter finals.</i>
comrade	A friend who is frequently in the company of another. <i>You re right comrade.</i>
comradeship	The company and friendship of others with common aims. <i>His greatest joy came from comradeship with others in the team.</i>
consort	Keep company. <i>It did not consort with his idea of scientific government.</i>
countryman	A man living or born in a rural area. <i>They trust a fellow countryman.</i>

<u>crony</u>	A close friend or companion. <i>He went gambling with his cronies.</i>
dandy	Relating to or characteristic of a dandy. <i>The Winchester Model 37 shotgun is a dandy at a low price.</i>
<u>dear</u>	A sweet or endearing person. <i>Martin my dear fellow.</i>
ex	Out of fashion. <i>All his exes live in Texas.</i>
<u>fellow</u>	Sharing a particular activity, quality, or condition with someone or something. <i>They urged the troops not to fire on their fellow citizens.</i>
folk	Relating to folk music. <i>A revival of interest in folk customs.</i>
friend	Add someone to a list of friends or contacts on a social networking website. <i>We are friends of the family.</i>
<u>friendship</u>	The state of being friends (or friendly). <i>Old ties of love and friendship.</i>
lad	A male child (a familiar term of address to a boy). <i>Tony was a bit of a lad always had an eye for the women.</i>
mate	South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly called mate. <i>A male is mated to several females.</i>
neighbour	A person living next door to or very near to the speaker or person referred to. <i>Matching our investment levels with those of our European neighbours.</i>
<u>pal</u>	Spend time with a friend. <i>We got acquainted but we never really palled around.</i>
<u>partner</u>	Act as a partner. <i>She and her dance partner were on the show for seven weeks.</i>
<u>peer</u>	A nobleman duke or marquis or earl or viscount or baron who is a member of the British peerage. <i>The towers peer over the roofs.</i>
<u>spouse</u>	A person's partner in marriage.
traveling	The act of going from one place to another.
workmate	A person with whom one works.
