- Of questionable or minimal quality.
- Only just acceptable in quality or as belonging to a category.



Synonyms of "Borderline" as an adjective (14 Words)

uncertain or unable to decide about what course to follow.

An ambivalent attitude to Europe.

doubtful Not established as genuine or acceptable.

It is **doubtful** whether these schemes have any lasting effect.

Open to two or more interpretations; or of uncertain nature or

significance; or (often) intended to mislead.

equivocal

The polling had a complex and equivocal or ambiguous message for

potential female candidates.



(of a word, inflection, or phrase) not determining the person, thing, time,
