Synonyms of "Borderline" as a noun (11 Words)

border

A district near the border between two areas.
*Panama s western **border** with Costa Rica.*

boundary line

A line determining the limits of an area.

cut-off point

A distinct part that can be specified separately in a group of things that could be enumerated on a list.

delimitation

The action of fixing the boundary or limits of something.
*The government is yet to pass legislation on **delimitation** of constituencies in the province.*

demarcation line

A particular kind of product or merchandise.

divide	A ridge or line of high ground forming the division between two valleys or river systems. <i>There was still a profound cultural divide between the parties.</i>
dividing line	A serious disagreement between two groups of people (typically producing tension or hostility).
division	Biology a group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>Deep cultural divisions.</i>
line	An arrangement of soldiers or ships in a column or line formation a line of battle. <i>Each stanza has eight lines.</i>
line of demarcation	A mark that is long relative to its width.
mete	A line that indicates a boundary.

Definitions of "Borderline" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "borderline" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Of questionable or minimal quality.*
- *Only just acceptable in quality or as belonging to a category.*



Synonyms of "Borderline" as an adjective (14 Words)

- [ambivalent](#)** Uncertain or unable to decide about what course to follow.
*An **ambivalent** attitude to Europe.*
- doubtful** Not established as genuine or acceptable.
*It is **doubtful** whether these schemes have any lasting effect.*
- equivocal** Open to two or more interpretations; or of uncertain nature or significance; or (often) intended to mislead.
*The polling had a complex and **equivocal** or ambiguous message for potential female candidates.*

indefinite	(of a word, inflection, or phrase) not determining the person, thing, time, etc. referred to. <i>Must you be so indefinite.</i>
indeterminate	(of a condition) from which a diagnosis of the underlying cause cannot be made. <i>A zillion is a large indeterminate number.</i>
marginal	Close to the limit of profitability, especially through difficulty of exploitation. <i>Marginal notes.</i>
open to doubt	Affording unobstructed entrance and exit; not shut or closed.
problematic	Constituting or presenting a problem. <i>The situation was problematic for teachers.</i>
uncertain	Lacking or indicating lack of confidence or assurance. <i>An uncertain recollection of events.</i>
unclassifiable	Not possible to classify. <i>The rock contains some unclassifiable arthropods.</i>
undecided	(of a person) not having made a decision. <i>The jury remained undecided.</i>
unsettled	Not settled or established. <i>Unsettled weather with rain and hail and sunshine coming one right after the other.</i>
unsure	(of a fact) not fixed or certain. <i>She was feeling nervous unsure of herself.</i>
up in the air	Out of bed.
