frontier	An undeveloped field of study; a topic inviting research and development. International crime knows no frontier s.
limit	Final or latest limiting point. The failure showed the limit s of British power.
limits	The greatest amount of something that is possible or allowed. There are limits on the amount you can bet.
line of demarcation	A length (straight or curved) without breadth or thickness; the trace of a moving point.
margins	The blank space that surrounds the text on a page. <i>He jotted a note in the margin.</i>
<u>parameters</u>	A quantity (such as the mean or variance) that characterizes a statistical population and that can be estimated by calculations from sample data.
partition	The act of dividing or partitioning separation by the creation of a boundary that divides or keeps apart. The cafe was divided up by glass partition s.




threshold	The starting point for a new state or experience. A threshold level.
thresholds	The sill of a door; a horizontal piece of wood or stone that forms the bottom of a doorway and offers support when passing through a doorway. On the threshold of manhood.

margin	A profit margin. <i>New contracts are margined with the winnings of previously held contracts.</i>
<u>marginal</u>	(of taxation) relating to increases in income. The issue is to estimate the marginal benefit from the increased frequency of screening examinations against the marginal increased cost.
marginally	In a marginal manner. He s marginally worse than he was.
<u>minimum</u>	The least possible. This can be done with the minimum amount of effort.
outer	An outer garment or part of one. <i>Outer reality</i> .
outermost	Situated at the farthest possible point from a center. The outermost layer of the earth.
