## Bourgeois as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Bourgeois" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "bourgeois" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Belonging to the middle class.*
- *(according to Marxist thought) being of the property-owning class and exploitive of the working class.*
- *Conforming to the standards and conventions of the middle class.*
- *(in Marxist contexts) upholding the interests of capitalism; not communist.*
- *Belonging to or characteristic of the middle class, typically with reference to its perceived materialistic values or conventional attitudes.*
- *Being of the property-owning class and exploitive of the working class.*





## Synonyms of "Bourgeois" as an adjective (7 Words)

<b>capitalistic</b>	Favoring or practicing capitalism. <i>A completely <b>capitalistic</b> system.</i>
<b><u>commercial</u></b>	Connected with or engaged in or sponsored by or used in commerce or commercial enterprises. <i><b>Commercial</b> trucker.</i>
<b><u>conservative</u></b>	Relating to the Conservative Party in the UK or a similar party elsewhere. <i>The film was not cheap 30 000 is a <b>conservative</b> estimate.</i>
<b>materialistic</b>	Conforming to the standards and conventions of the middle class. <i>We re living in a highly <b>materialistic</b> society.</i>

- middle-class** Occupying a socioeconomic position intermediate between those of the lower classes and the wealthy.
- propertied** (of a person or group) owning property and land, especially in large amounts.  
*A **propertied** country gentleman.*
- property-owning** Owning land or securities as a principal source of revenue.





## Usage Examples of "Bourgeois" as an adjective

- *Bourgeois society took for granted the sanctity of property.*
- *These views will shock the bourgeois critics.*
- *A rich, bored, bourgeois family.*
- *A bourgeois mentality.*

A privileged class holding hereditary titles.  
Britain's pop **aristocracy**.



<b>aristocrat</b>	A member of the aristocracy. <i>The trout is the <b>aristocrat</b> of freshwater fish.</i>
<b>aristocratic</b>	Belonging to or characteristic of the nobility or aristocracy. <i><b>Aristocratic</b> features.</i>
<b>burgess</b>	A citizen of an English borough.
<b>burgher</b>	A citizen of a town or city, typically a member of the wealthy bourgeoisie. <i>The poem is not the sort of thing the sturdy <b>burghers</b> of Manchester would wish to read.</i>
<b>capitalism</b>	An economic and political system in which a country's trade and industry are controlled by private owners for profit, rather than by the state. <i>Private ownership is a key feature of <b>capitalism</b>.</i>
<b>capitalist</b>	Of or relating to capitalism or capitalists. <i><b>Capitalistic</b> methods and incentives.</i>
<b>citizen</b>	A native or naturalized member of a state or other political community. <i>A British <b>citizen</b>.</i>
<b>civil</b>	Relating to civil law. <i>A <b>civil</b> action.</i>
<b>communism</b>	A political theory favoring collectivism in a classless society.
<b>communist</b>	A member of the communist party. <i><b>Communistic</b> propaganda.</i>
<b>conservative</b>	A person who is averse to change and holds traditional values. <i>Police placed the value of the haul at a <b>conservative</b> 500 000.</i>
<b>consul</b>	Any of the three chief magistrates of the first French republic (1799-1804). <i>The British <b>consul</b> in Israel.</i>
<b>cultural</b>	Relating to the ideas, customs, and social behaviour of a society. <i>A <b>cultural</b> festival.</i>
<b>culture</b>	A preparation of cells obtained by culture. <i>The reason that the agency is doomed to inaction has something to do with the FBI <b>culture</b>.</i>
<b>dictatorship</b>	A form of government in which the ruler is an absolute dictator (not restricted by a constitution or laws or opposition etc). <i>The effects of forty years of <b>dictatorship</b>.</i>
<b>intelligentsia</b>	Intellectuals or highly educated people as a group, especially when regarded as possessing culture and political influence. <i>A distrust of the <b>intelligentsia</b> and of theoretical learning.</i>

<b>labor</b>	A political party formed in Great Britain in 1900 characterized by the promotion of labor's interests and formerly the socialization of key industries. <i>There is a shortage of skilled <b>labor</b> in this field.</i>
<b>libertarian</b>	An advocate of libertarianism. <i>He holds <b>libertarian</b> views on most social issues.</i>
<b>materialistic</b>	Marked by materialism. <i>We're living in a highly <b>materialistic</b> society.</i>
<u><b>national</b></u>	Owned or maintained for the public by the national government. <i><b>National</b> parks.</i>
<u><b>noble</b></u>	Especially in former times a person of noble rank or birth. <i><b>Noble</b> deeds.</i>
<b>patrician</b>	Befitting a person of noble origin. <i><b>Patrician</b> tastes.</i>
<b>philistine</b>	Smug and ignorant and indifferent or hostile to artistic and cultural values. <i>There were displays to inspire even the most <b>philistine</b> of visitors.</i>
<b>proletarian</b>	A member of the proletariat. <i>They are true <b>proletarians</b>.</i>
<u><b>proletariat</b></u>	The lowest class of citizens in ancient Rome. <i>The growth of the industrial <b>proletariat</b>.</i>
<b>resident</b>	An intelligence agent in a foreign country. <i>It was a beautiful hamlet with just 100 <b>residents</b>.</i>
<u><b>revolutionary</b></u>	A radical supporter of political or social revolution. <i>A <b>revolutionary</b> new drug.</i>
<u><b>utopia</b></u>	A work of fiction describing a utopia. <i>Misplaced faith in political <b>utopias</b> has led to ruin.</i>
