Bourgeois as an Adjective

Definitions of "Bourgeois" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "bourgeois" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Belonging to the middle class.
- (according to Marxist thought) being of the property-owning class and exploitive of the working class.
- Conforming to the standards and conventions of the middle class.
- (in Marxist contexts) upholding the interests of capitalism; not communist.
- Belonging to or characteristic of the middle class, typically with reference to its perceived materialistic values or conventional attitudes.
- Being of the property-owning class and exploitive of the working class.





Synonyms of "Bourgeois" as an adjective (7 Words)

capitalistic	Favoring or practicing capitalism. A completely capitalistic system.
<u>commercial</u>	Connected with or engaged in or sponsored by or used in commerce or commercial enterprises. <i>Commercial trucker.</i>
<u>conservative</u>	Relating to the Conservative Party in the UK or a similar party elsewhere. The film was not cheap 30 000 is a conservative estimate.
materialistic	Conforming to the standards and conventions of the middle class. <i>We re living in a highly materialistic society.</i>



middle-class	Occupying a socioeconomic position intermediate between those of the lower classes and the wealthy.
propertied	(of a person or group) owning property and land, especially in large amounts. A propertied country gentleman.

property-owning Owning land or securities as a principal source of revenue.

<u>anarchist</u>	Relating to or supporting anarchism or anarchy. An anarchist newspaper.
<u>aristocracy</u>	A privileged class holding hereditary titles. <i>Britain s pop aristocracy.</i>



aristocrat	A member of the aristocracy. The trout is the aristocrat of freshwater fish.
<u>aristocratic</u>	Belonging to or characteristic of the nobility or aristocracy. <i>Aristocratic features.</i>

<u>capitalism</u>	An economic and political system in which a country's trade and industry are controlled by private owners for profit, rather than by the state. <i>Private ownership is a key feature of</i> capitalism .
capitalist	Of or relating to capitalism or capitalists. <i>Capitalist</i> ic methods and incentives.
<u>citizen</u>	A native or naturalized member of a state or other political community. <i>A British citizen</i> .
<u>civil</u>	Relating to civil law. A civil action.
<u>communism</u>	A political theory favoring collectivism in a classless society.
<u>communist</u>	A member of the communist party. <i>Communist</i> ic propaganda.
<u>conservative</u>	A person who is averse to change and holds traditional values. Police placed the value of the haul at a conservative 500 000.
consul	Any of the three chief magistrates of the first French republic (1799–1804). <i>The British consul in Israel.</i>
cultural	Relating to the ideas, customs, and social behaviour of a society. A <i>cultural festival</i> .
culture	A preparation of cells obtained by culture. The reason that the agency is doomed to inaction has something to do with the FBI culture .
dictatorship	A form of government in which the ruler is an absolute dictator (not restricted by a constitution or laws or opposition etc. <i>The effects of forty years of dictatorship</i> .
	Intellectuals or highly educated people as a group, especially when regarded as possessing culture and political influence. <i>A distrust of the intelligentsia and of theoretical learning.</i>



labor	A political party formed in Great Britain in 1900 characterized by the promotion of labor s interests and formerly the socialization of key industries. There is a shortage of skilled labor in this field.
libertarian	An advocate of libertarianism. He holds libertarian views on most social issues.
materialistic	Marked by materialism. We re living in a highly materialistic society.
<u>national</u>	Owned or maintained for the public by the national government. <i>National parks</i> .
<u>noble</u>	Especially in former times a person of noble rank or birth. <i>Noble deeds.</i>
patrician	Befitting a person of noble origin. <i>Patrician</i> tastes.
philistine	Smug and ignorant and indifferent or hostile to artistic and cultural values. There were displays to inspire even the most philistine of visitors.
proletarian	A member of the proletariat. They are true proletarian s.
<u>proletariat</u>	The lowest class of citizens in ancient Rome. <i>The growth of the industrial proletariat.</i>
resident	An intelligence agent in a foreign country. It was a beautiful hamlet with just 100 resident s.
<u>revolutionary</u>	A radical supporter of political or social revolution. A revolutionary new drug.
<u>utopia</u>	A work of fiction describing a utopia. Misplaced faith in political utopia s has led to ruin.
