Bourgeois as an Adjective

Definitions of "Bourgeois" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "bourgeois" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Belonging to the middle class.*
- *(according to Marxist thought) being of the property-owning class and exploitive of the working class.*
- *Conforming to the standards and conventions of the middle class.*
- *(in Marxist contexts) upholding the interests of capitalism; not communist.*
- *Belonging to or characteristic of the middle class, typically with reference to its perceived materialistic values or conventional attitudes.*
- *Being of the property-owning class and exploitive of the working class.*



Synonyms of "Bourgeois" as an adjective (7 Words)

capitalistic	Favoring or practicing capitalism. <i>A completely capitalistic system.</i>
<u>commercial</u>	Connected with or engaged in or sponsored by or used in commerce or commercial enterprises. <i>Commercial trucker.</i>
<u>conservative</u>	Relating to the Conservative Party in the UK or a similar party elsewhere. <i>The film was not cheap 30 000 is a conservative estimate.</i>
materialistic	Conforming to the standards and conventions of the middle class. <i>We re living in a highly materialistic society.</i>

- middle-class** Occupying a socioeconomic position intermediate between those of the lower classes and the wealthy.
- propertied** (of a person or group) owning property and land, especially in large amounts.
*A **propertied** country gentleman.*
- property-owning** Owning land or securities as a principal source of revenue.



Usage Examples of "Bourgeois" as an adjective

- *Bourgeois society took for granted the sanctity of property.*
- *These views will shock the bourgeois critics.*
- *A rich, bored, bourgeois family.*
- *A bourgeois mentality.*

aristocrat	A member of the aristocracy. <i>The trout is the aristocrat of freshwater fish.</i>
<u>aristocratic</u>	Belonging to or characteristic of the nobility or aristocracy. <i>Aristocratic features.</i>
burgess	A citizen of an English borough.
burgher	A citizen of a town or city, typically a member of the wealthy bourgeoisie. <i>The poem is not the sort of thing the sturdy burghers of Manchester would wish to read.</i>
<u>capitalism</u>	An economic and political system in which a country's trade and industry are controlled by private owners for profit, rather than by the state. <i>Private ownership is a key feature of capitalism.</i>
capitalist	Of or relating to capitalism or capitalists. <i>Capitalistic methods and incentives.</i>
<u>citizen</u>	A native or naturalized member of a state or other political community. <i>A British citizen.</i>
<u>civil</u>	Relating to civil law. <i>A civil action.</i>
<u>communism</u>	A political theory favoring collectivism in a classless society.
<u>communist</u>	A member of the communist party. <i>Communistic propaganda.</i>
<u>conservative</u>	A person who is averse to change and holds traditional values. <i>Police placed the value of the haul at a conservative 500 000.</i>
consul	Any of the three chief magistrates of the first French republic (1799-1804). <i>The British consul in Israel.</i>
cultural	Relating to the ideas, customs, and social behaviour of a society. <i>A cultural festival.</i>
culture	A preparation of cells obtained by culture. <i>The reason that the agency is doomed to inaction has something to do with the FBI culture.</i>
dictatorship	A form of government in which the ruler is an absolute dictator (not restricted by a constitution or laws or opposition etc). <i>The effects of forty years of dictatorship.</i>
intelligentsia	Intellectuals or highly educated people as a group, especially when regarded as possessing culture and political influence. <i>A distrust of the intelligentsia and of theoretical learning.</i>

labor	A political party formed in Great Britain in 1900 characterized by the promotion of labor's interests and formerly the socialization of key industries. <i>There is a shortage of skilled labor in this field.</i>
libertarian	An advocate of libertarianism. <i>He holds libertarian views on most social issues.</i>
materialistic	Marked by materialism. <i>We're living in a highly materialistic society.</i>
<u>national</u>	Owned or maintained for the public by the national government. <i>National parks.</i>
<u>noble</u>	Especially in former times a person of noble rank or birth. <i>Noble deeds.</i>
patrician	Befitting a person of noble origin. <i>Patrician tastes.</i>
philistine	Smug and ignorant and indifferent or hostile to artistic and cultural values. <i>There were displays to inspire even the most philistine of visitors.</i>
proletarian	A member of the proletariat. <i>They are true proletarians.</i>
<u>proletariat</u>	The lowest class of citizens in ancient Rome. <i>The growth of the industrial proletariat.</i>
resident	An intelligence agent in a foreign country. <i>It was a beautiful hamlet with just 100 residents.</i>
<u>revolutionary</u>	A radical supporter of political or social revolution. <i>A revolutionary new drug.</i>
<u>utopia</u>	A work of fiction describing a utopia. <i>Misplaced faith in political utopias has led to ruin.</i>
