**turn** The act of turning away or in the opposite direction. *He was asked to do a turn at a children s party.* 






# Usage Examples of "Bouts" as a noun

**binge**An occasion for excessive eating or drinking.

bust Break open or apart suddenly and forcefully.

He **bust**ed my radio.

**colonnade** Structure consisting of a row of evenly spaced columns.

**conglomerate** Form a conglomerate by merging diverse firms. *Atoms which* **conglomerate** at the centre.

Consisting of two atoms.

**diatomic** Only **diatomic** molecules are easy to study in this way as larger molecules

invariably fragment.
