### **Definitions of "Bouts" as a noun**

**tear** The act of tearing.

*He took the manuscript in both hands and gave it a mighty **tear**.*

**turn** The act of turning away or in the opposite direction.

*He was asked to do a **turn** at a children s party.*

## Associations of "Bouts" (30 Words)

<b>binge</b>	An occasion for excessive eating or drinking. <i>I <b>binged</b> on all six episodes in two days.</i>
<b>bust</b>	Break open or apart suddenly and forcefully. <i>He <b>busted</b> my radio.</i>
<b>colonnade</b>	Structure consisting of a row of evenly spaced columns.
<b>conglomerate</b>	Form a conglomerate by merging diverse firms. <i>Atoms which <b>conglomerate</b> at the centre.</i>
<b>diatomic</b>	Consisting of two atoms. <i>Only <b>diatomic</b> molecules are easy to study in this way as larger molecules invariably fragment.</i>
<b>double</b>	To double the degree. <i>She <b>doubles</b> as his wife and secretary.</i>

<b>doubled</b>	Twice as great or many. <i>The dose is <b>doubled</b>.</i>
<b>doubly</b>	To twice the normal extent or degree; especially. <i>We re going to have to work <b>doubly</b> hard.</i>
<b>dual</b>	In an aircraft using dual controls. <i>A double or <b>dual</b> role for an actor.</i>
<b>game</b>	The game equipment needed in order to play a particular game. <i>It was very easy for a few big companies to <b>game</b> the system.</i>
<b>homer</b>	A home run. <i>He <b>homered</b> for the sixth time in seven games.</i>
<b>multiple</b>	Numerous and often varied. <i>The major food <b>multiples</b>.</i>
<b>multiplication</b>	An arithmetic operation that is the inverse of division; the product of two numbers is computed. <i>These formulae involve a number of <b>multiplications</b>.</i>
<b>once</b>	At a previous time. <i>She was a dancer <b>once</b>.</i>
<b>one</b>	Being a single entity made by combining separate components. <i>They had lunch at <b>one</b>.</i>
<b>only</b>	Being the only one single and isolated from others. <i>She turned into the car park <b>only</b> to find her way blocked.</i>
<b>pike</b>	Used in names of predatory fish with large teeth other than the true pike e g garpike.
<b>plural</b>	A plural word or form. <i>A <b>plural</b> society.</i>
<b>redouble</b>	Double a bid already doubled by an opponent. <i>The screaming <b>redoubled</b>.</i>
<b>single</b>	Characteristic of or meant for a single person or thing. <i>A first class <b>single</b> ticket.</i>
<b>subjugation</b>	The action of bringing someone or something under domination or control. <i>The fear of human <b>subjugation</b> by technology.</i>
<b>talking</b>	The action of talking speech or discussion. <i>He did have <b>talking</b> eyes.</i>
<b>ternary</b>	The cardinal number that is the sum of one and one and one. <i>A <b>ternary</b> operation.</i>
<b>three</b>	One of four playing cards in a deck having three pips.

- times** An arithmetic operation that is the inverse of division; the product of two numbers is computed.  
*It was a sign of the **times**.*
- trinity** The union of the Father and Son and Holy Ghost in one Godhead.  
*The wine was the first of a **trinity** of three excellent vintages.*
- triple** Hit a triple.  
*Two whiskies **triples** please.*
- twice** Double in degree or quantity.  
*I m **twice** your age.*
- twofold** So as to double; to twice the number or amount.  
*The **twofold** demands of the business and motherhood.*
- walkway** A passage or path for walking along, especially a raised passageway connecting different sections of a building or a wide path in a park or garden.
