## Associations of "Bow out" (30 Words)

<b>aloha</b>	An utterance of aloha. <i>The <b>aloha</b> spirit.</i>
<b>aquiline</b>	(of a person's nose) hooked or curved like an eagle's beak.
<b>arc</b>	Form an electric arc. <i>The outage was caused by a bad switch that <b>arced</b>.</i>
<a href="#">archer</a>	(astrology) a person who is born while the sun is in Sagittarius.
<b>archery</b>	Shooting with a bow and arrows, especially at a target as a sport.
<b>badminton</b>	A game played on a court with light long-handled rackets used to volley a shuttlecock over a net.
<b>bend</b>	Bend one's back forward from the waist on down. <i>They want to <b>bend</b> me to their will.</i>
<a href="#">bent</a>	Homosexual (typically used of a man). <i>A piece of <b>bent</b> wire.</i>
<b>bowstring</b>	Strangle with a bowstring a former Turkish method of execution.
<b>bye</b>	A farewell remark. <i>He had a <b>bye</b> in the first round.</i>
<b>condescend</b>	Treat condescendingly. <i>Take care not to <b>condescend</b> to your reader.</i>
<b>crouch</b>	A crouching stance or posture. <i>He <b>crouched</b> down.</i>
<b>cudgel</b>	Strike with a cudgel. <i>They would lie in wait and <b>cudgel</b> her to death.</i>
<a href="#">curve</a>	Curved segment of a road or river or railroad track etc. <i>Her dress twisted tightly round her generous <b>curves</b>.</i>
<b>ductile</b>	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out. <i><b>Ductile</b> copper.</i>

<b>exhale</b>	Breathe out. <i>The jungle <b>exhaled</b> mists of early morning.</i>
<b>fencing</b>	The erection of fences. <i>The horse makes his <b>fencing</b> debut today.</i>
<b>flex</b>	The action or state of flexing. <i>She saw him <b>flex</b> his ankle and wince.</i>
<b>flexibly</b>	In a way that bends easily without breaking. <i>The ability of governments to respond <b>flexibly</b> to changing economic circumstances.</i>
<b>fold</b>	Become folded or folded up. <i><b>Fold</b> up the newspaper.</i>
<b>goodbye</b>	An instance of saying goodbye a parting. <i>We said our <b>goodbyes</b> and set off.</i>
<b>greeting</b>	A polite word or sign of welcome or recognition. <i>Mandy shouted a <b>greeting</b>.</i>
<b>hi</b>	A state in the United States in the central Pacific on the Hawaiian Islands.
<b>hooked</b>	Curved down like an eagle's beak. <i>A girl who got <b>hooked</b> on cocaine.</i>
<b>pucker</b>	Draw together into folds or puckers. <i>The baby stirred <b>puckering</b> up its face.</i>
<b>refract</b>	Subject to refraction. <i>When <b>refracting</b> patients an ophthalmologist relies on verbal reports.</i>
<b>salutation</b>	(usually plural) an acknowledgment or expression of good will (especially on meeting). <i>He raised his glass in <b>salutation</b>.</i>
<b>shield</b>	A sporting trophy shaped like a shield consisting of an engraved metal plate mounted on a piece of wood. <i>A face <b>shield</b> is sometimes an integral part of a safety helmet.</i>
<b>stoop</b>	Bend one's back forward from the waist on down. <i>I won't <b>stoop</b> to reading other people's mail.</i>
<b>winding</b>	The act of winding or twisting. <i>The <b>windings</b> of the stream.</i>
