- *A man who is the lover of a girl or young woman.*
- *A person's regular male companion with whom they have a romantic or sexual relationship.*

- admirer** A person who backs a politician or a team etc.
*She s got a secret **admirer**.*
- baggy** Loose, wide-legged trousers or shorts.
- beau** A rich, fashionable young man; a dandy.
- fellow** One of a pair.
*He sent e mail to his **fellow** hackers.*
- follower** Someone who is tracking a particular person, group, organization, etc. on a social media website or application.
*She remains an immensely divisive figure but she has a million **followers** on Facebook.*
- lover** An ardent follower and admirer.
*They had been **lovers** for years.*
- man** A human being of either sex a person.
*Cro Magnon **man**.*

- partner** A person who is a member of a partnership.
*She lived with her **partner**.*
- roomy** An associate who shares a room with you.
- slack** Dust consisting of a mixture of small coal fragments and coal dust and dirt that sifts out when coal is passed over a sieve.
*I picked up the rod and wound in the **slack**.*
- suitor** A man who courts a woman.
*She decided to marry her **suitor**.*
- swain** A young lover or suitor.
- wooner** The trees and other plants in a large densely wooded area.
- young man** United States jazz tenor saxophonist (1909-1959).



Usage Examples of "Boyfriend" as a noun

- A boyfriend cardigan.
- When the law changed, Pet could finally married his long-time boyfriend Jim.

- *If I'd known he was her boyfriend I wouldn't have asked.*

| mistress | A woman master who directs the work of others. <i>She is always mistress of the situation coolly self possessed.</i> |
| moll | A gangster's female companion. <i>I d rush the money over to his moll.</i> |
| outmoded | Out of fashion. <i>Demode or outmoded attire.</i> |
| paramour | A woman who cohabits with an important man. |
| troth | A mutual promise to marry. <i>A token of troth.</i> |
| votary | A devoted follower, adherent, or advocate of someone or something. <i>A votary of Aphrodite.</i> |
