Definitions of "Boyfriend" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “boyfriend” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Denoting an item of clothing for a woman or girl that is designed to be loose-fitting or slightly oversized.*
- *A man who is the lover of a man or woman.*
- *A man who is the lover of a girl or young woman.*
- *A person's regular male companion with whom they have a romantic or sexual relationship.*



Synonyms of "Boyfriend" as a noun (15 Words)

<u>admirer</u>	A person who backs a politician or a team etc. <i>She s got a secret admirer.</i>
baggy	Loose, wide-legged trousers or shorts.
beau	A rich, fashionable young man; a dandy.
<u>fellow</u>	One of a pair. <i>He sent e mail to his fellow hackers.</i>
follower	Someone who is tracking a particular person, group, organization, etc. on a social media website or application. <i>She remains an immensely divisive figure but she has a million followers on Facebook.</i>
<u>lover</u>	An ardent follower and admirer. <i>They had been lovers for years.</i>
man	A human being of either sex a person. <i>Cro Magnon man.</i>

- partner** A person who is a member of a partnership.
*She lived with her **partner**.*
- roomy** An associate who shares a room with you.
- slack** Dust consisting of a mixture of small coal fragments and coal dust and dirt that sifts out when coal is passed over a sieve.
*I picked up the rod and wound in the **slack**.*
- suitor** A man who courts a woman.
*She decided to marry her **suitor**.*
- swain** A young lover or suitor.
- wooner** The trees and other plants in a large densely wooded area.
- young man** United States jazz tenor saxophonist (1909-1959).



Usage Examples of "Boyfriend" as a noun

- A boyfriend cardigan.
- When the law changed, Pet could finally married his long-time boyfriend Jim.

- *If I'd known he was her boyfriend I wouldn't have asked.*

<u>bachelor</u>	A bachelor apartment. <i>It s just one room a bachelor.</i>
beau	A boyfriend or male admirer.
betroth	Give to in marriage. <i>In no time I shall be betrothed to Isabel.</i>
<u>buff</u>	Of the yellowish beige color of buff leather. <i>There are cards that ll buff your troops.</i>
<u>concubine</u>	A woman who cohabits with an important man.
<u>couple</u>	Form a pair or pairs. <i>A married couple from Chicago.</i>

devotee	An ardent follower and admirer. <i>Devotees of Krishna.</i>
estranged	(of a person) no longer close or affectionate to someone; alienated. <i>His estranged wife.</i>
ex	A man who was formerly a certain woman's husband. <i>All his exes live in Texas.</i>
fan	A fan shaped alluvial or talus deposit at the foot of a slope. <i>His breath fanned her skin as he leant towards her.</i>
father	A male parent also used as a term of address to your father. <i>They assumed that I was the father of the child.</i>
fellow	A member of a learned society. <i>He sent e mail to his fellow hackers.</i>
fiance	A man who is engaged to be married.
fiancee	A woman who is engaged to be married.
girlfriend	A girl or young woman with whom a man is romantically involved. <i>His girlfriend kicked him out.</i>
guy	Steady or support with a guy wire or cable. <i>A nice guy.</i>
husband	A married man; a woman's partner in marriage. <i>She and her husband are both retired.</i>
idolater	A person who worships an idol or idols.
idolatry	The worship of idols. <i>We must not allow our idolatry of art to obscure issues of political significance.</i>
lover	A person who loves someone or is loved by someone. <i>They had been lovers for years.</i>
mistress	A woman master who directs the work of others. <i>She is always mistress of the situation coolly self possessed.</i>
moll	A gangster's female companion. <i>I d rush the money over to his moll.</i>
outmoded	Out of fashion. <i>Demode or outmoded attire.</i>
paramour	A woman who cohabits with an important man.
troth	A mutual promise to marry. <i>A token of troth.</i>
votary	A devoted follower, adherent, or advocate of someone or something. <i>A votary of Aphrodite.</i>

wed	Get married. <i>They were wed in London.</i>
widower	A man who has lost his spouse by death and has not married again. <i>Her new found passion has turned me into a tennis widower.</i>
<u>wife</u>	The wife of a person with a specified occupation. <i>A clergy wife.</i>
