Definitions of "Bramble" as a noun

- *The fruit of the blackberry.*
- *A prickly scrambling shrub of the rose family, especially a blackberry.*
- *Any of various rough thorny shrubs or vines.*



Synonyms of "Bramble" as a noun (16 Words)

- brush** The act of brushing your teeth.
*A **brush** with death.*
- brushwood** A dense growth of bushes.
*They built a fire of **brushwood**.*
- coppice** An area of woodland in which the trees or shrubs are periodically cut back to ground level to stimulate growth and provide firewood or timber.
*Much **coppice** is no longer managed as such.*
- [copse](#) A dense growth of bushes.
- cover** The amount of ground covered by a vertical projection of the vegetation usually expressed as a percentage.
*Put the **cover** back on the kettle.*
- [covert](#) A covering that serves to conceal or shelter something.
*It is a good omen when a **covert** of coots have taken to any particular locality.*

greenery	Green foliage, growing plants, or vegetation.
ground cover	Material in the top layer of the surface of the earth in which plants can grow (especially with reference to its quality or use).
jungle	An impenetrable equatorial forest. <i>We set off into the jungle.</i>
scrub	An act of scrubbing something or someone. <i>Bill emerged from the delivery room in green scrubs.</i>
shrubbery	A collection of shrubs growing together.
thicket	A dense group of bushes or trees. <i>A horned owl perfectly camouflaged in a dense thicket.</i>
underscrub	Undergrowth, especially in a forest. <i>The underscrub was wiregrass and small rushes.</i>
underwood	The brush (small trees and bushes and ferns etc.) growing beneath taller trees in a wood or forest. <i>They sell underwood belonging to the Crown.</i>
vegetation	An abnormal growth or excrescence (especially a warty excrescence on the valves of the heart). <i>Pleistocene vegetation.</i>
wood	A golf club with a wooden or other head that is relatively broad from face to back often with a numeral indicating the degree to which the face is angled to loft the ball. <i>Wines from the wood.</i>
