coppice to ground level to stimulate growth and provide firewood or timber.

Much **coppice** is no longer managed as such.

copse A dense growth of bushes.

The amount of ground covered by a vertical projection of the vegetation

cover usually expressed as a percentage.

Put the **cover** back on the kettle.

A covering that serves to conceal or shelter something.

covert It is a good omen when a **covert** of coots have taken to any particular

locality.



greenery Green foliage, growing plants, or vegetation.

ground cover Material in the top layer of the surface of the earth in which plants can

grow (especially with reference to its quality or use.

jungle An impenetrable equatorial forest.

We set off into the **jungle**.

An act of scrubbing something or someone.

Bill emerged from the delivery room in green **scrub**s.

shrubbery A collection of shrubs growing together.

thicket A dense group of bushes or trees.

A horned owl perfectly camouflaged in a dense **thicket**.

underscrub Undergrowth, especially in a forest.

The **underscrub** was wiregrass and small rushes.

The brush (small trees and bushes and ferns etc.) growing beneath taller

underwood trees in a wood or forest.

They sell **underwood** belonging to the Crown.

An abnormal growth or excrescence (especially a warty excrescence on the

vegetation valves of the heart.

Pleistocene **vegetation**.

A golf club with a wooden or other head that is relatively broad from face to

back often with a numeral indicating the degree to which the face is angled

to loft the ball.

Wines from the **wood**.
