### **Definitions of "Bramble" as a noun**

- *A prickly scrambling shrub of the rose family, especially a blackberry.*
- *Any of various rough thorny shrubs or vines.*



## Synonyms of "Bramble" as a noun (16 Words)

<b>brush</b>	The act of brushing your teeth. <i>A <b>brush</b> with death.</i>
<b>brushwood</b>	A dense growth of bushes. <i>They built a fire of <b>brushwood</b>.</i>
<b>coppice</b>	An area of woodland in which the trees or shrubs are periodically cut back to ground level to stimulate growth and provide firewood or timber. <i>Much <b>coppice</b> is no longer managed as such.</i>
<a href="#">copse</a>	A dense growth of bushes.
<b>cover</b>	The amount of ground covered by a vertical projection of the vegetation usually expressed as a percentage. <i>Put the <b>cover</b> back on the kettle.</i>
<a href="#">covert</a>	A covering that serves to conceal or shelter something. <i>It is a good omen when a <b>covert</b> of coots have taken to any particular locality.</i>

<b>greenery</b>	Green foliage, growing plants, or vegetation.
<b>ground cover</b>	Material in the top layer of the surface of the earth in which plants can grow (especially with reference to its quality or use).
<b>jungle</b>	An impenetrable equatorial forest. <i>We set off into the <b>jungle</b>.</i>
<b>scrub</b>	An act of scrubbing something or someone. <i>Bill emerged from the delivery room in green <b>scrubs</b>.</i>
<b>shrubbery</b>	A collection of shrubs growing together.
<b>thicket</b>	A dense group of bushes or trees. <i>A horned owl perfectly camouflaged in a dense <b>thicket</b>.</i>
<b>underscrub</b>	Undergrowth, especially in a forest. <i>The <b>underscrub</b> was wiregrass and small rushes.</i>
<b>underwood</b>	The brush (small trees and bushes and ferns etc.) growing beneath taller trees in a wood or forest. <i>They sell <b>underwood</b> belonging to the Crown.</i>
<b>vegetation</b>	An abnormal growth or excrescence (especially a warty excrescence on the valves of the heart). <i>Pleistocene <b>vegetation</b>.</i>
<b>wood</b>	A golf club with a wooden or other head that is relatively broad from face to back often with a numeral indicating the degree to which the face is angled to loft the ball. <i>Wines from the <b>wood</b>.</i>
