- stain** A penetrative dye or chemical used in colouring a material or object.

- steel** A rod of roughened steel on which knives are sharpened.
***Steel** girders.*
- stigma** A symbol of disgrace or infamy.
*The **stigma** of having gone to prison will always be with me.*
- sword** Military power, violence, or destruction.
*Not many perished by the **sword**.*
- trade name** The commercial exchange (buying and selling on domestic or international markets) of goods and services.

- *Burn with a branding iron to indicate ownership; of animals.*

distributor	A company that markets merchandise. <i>His company is a large distributor of software products.</i>
fabricate	Construct or manufacture (an industrial product), especially from prepared components. <i>The company fabricates plastic chairs.</i>
forge	Move or act with a sudden increase in speed or energy. <i>She forged a Green Card.</i>
found	Use as a basis for found on. <i>Collages of found photos.</i>
infomercial	A television commercial presented in the form of a short documentary.
invent	Concoct something artificial or untrue. <i>I did not have to invent any tales about my past.</i>
logo	A symbol or other small design adopted by an organization to identify its products, uniform, vehicles, etc. <i>The Olympic logo was emblazoned across the tracksuits.</i>
make	Make by combining materials and parts. <i>How much do you make a month in your new job.</i>
maker	God. <i>Makers of rubber products.</i>
making	The process of making or producing something. <i>Decision making.</i>
manufacturer	A person or company that makes goods for sale. <i>The manufacturers supply the goods to the distribution centre.</i>
manufacturing	The act of making something (a product) from raw materials. <i>Even in manufacturing they no longer dominate.</i>
marketing	The exchange of goods for an agreed sum of money. <i>Most companies have a manager in charge of marketing.</i>
mascot	A person or animal that is adopted by a team or other group as a symbolic figure. <i>The team's dolphin mascot.</i>
merchandise	Engage in the business of a merchant. <i>Good business depends on having good merchandise.</i>
motto	A phrase which recurs throughout a musical work and has some symbolical significance. <i>They were developing the use of leitmotifs or mottoes that appear throughout an opera.</i>

output	What is produced in a given time period. <i>The computer is outputting the data from the job I m running.</i>
producer	Someone who finds financing for and supervises the making and presentation of a show (play or film or program or similar work). <i>He remains a prolific producer of poems and short stories.</i>
product	The set of elements common to two or more sets. <i>Food products.</i>
repairer	A skilled worker who mends or repairs things.
shibboleth	A favorite saying of a sect or political group. <i>Liberal shibboleths about education.</i>
slogan	A favorite saying of a sect or political group. <i>Students were chanting slogans.</i>
trademark	Register the trademark of. <i>The company trademarked their new gadget.</i>
truism	A statement that is obviously true and says nothing new or interesting. <i>The truism that you get what you pay for.</i>
ware	Articles of the same kind or material usually used in combination silverware software. <i>Crystal ware.</i>
