<b>bald-faced</b>	Having white markings on the face.

<b>brassy</b>	Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times. <i>Audience members are tapping their feet to the <b>brassy</b> music of the band.</i>
<b>brazen-faced</b>	Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times.
<b><u>forward</u></b>	Moving forward. <i>The <b>forward</b> cargo doors.</i>
<b>immodest</b>	Lacking humility or decency. <i>His <b>immodest</b> personality.</i>
<b><u>insolent</u></b>	Unrestrained by convention or propriety. <i>She hated the <b>insolent</b> tone of his voice.</i>
<b>metallic</b>	Having the lustre of metal; iridescent. <i><b>Metallic</b> luster.</i>
<b><u>presumptuous</u></b>	(of a person or their behaviour) failing to observe the limits of what is permitted or appropriate. <i>I hope I won't be considered <b>presumptuous</b> if I offer some advice.</i>
<b>shameless</b>	(of a person or their conduct) characterized by or showing a lack of shame; barefaced or brazen. <i>A <b>shameless</b> imposter.</i>
<b><u>unabashed</u></b>	Not embarrassed, disconcerted, or ashamed. <i>A tinselled charm and <b>unabashed</b> sentimentality.</i>
<b><u>unashamed</u></b>	Expressed or acting openly and without guilt or embarrassment. <i>An <b>unashamed</b> emotionalism.</i>
<b>unblushing</b>	Feeling no shame. <i>A comedy of manners encased in the most <b>unblushing</b> melodrama.</i>
<b>unembarrassed</b>	Not feeling or showing embarrassment. <i>An <b>unembarrassed</b> greeting as if nothing untoward had happened.</i>

<b>arrogant</b>	Having or revealing an exaggerated sense of one's own importance or abilities. <i>He s <b>arrogant</b> and opinionated.</i>
<b>audacious</b>	Showing a willingness to take surprisingly bold risks. <i><b>Audacious</b> visions of the total conquest of space.</i>
<b>barefaced</b>	Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times. <i>His years of working <b>barefaced</b> breathing down dust.</i>
<b>blatant</b>	(of bad behaviour) done openly and unashamedly. <i>Despite their <b>blatant</b> attraction to each other they try to stay just friends.</i>
<b>bold</b>	A bold typeface or letter. <i>A <b>bold</b> speech.</i>
<b>chutzpah</b>	Unbelievable gall; insolence; audacity. <i>Love him or hate him you have to admire Cohen s <b>chutzpah</b>.</i>
<b>effrontery</b>	Insolent or impertinent behaviour. <i>One juror had the <b>effrontery</b> to challenge the coroner s decision.</i>
<b>flaunt</b>	Display proudly; act ostentatiously or pretentiously. <i>His behavior was an outrageous <b>flaunt</b>.</i>
<b>gall</b>	The contents of the gall bladder bile proverbial for its bitterness. <i>It <b>galls</b> me that we lost the suit.</i>
<b>glaring</b>	Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible. <i>A <b>glaring</b> error.</i>
<b>ignorant</b>	Discourteous or rude. <i>An <b>ignorant</b> man.</i>
<b>impenitent</b>	Impervious to moral persuasion. <i><b>Impenitent</b> elitists.</i>
<b>impertinence</b>	Lack of respect; rudeness. <i>They gasped at the <b>impertinence</b> of the suggestion.</i>
<b>impertinent</b>	Not pertinent to the matter under consideration. <i>Talk of rhetoric and strategy is <b>impertinent</b> to this process.</i>
<b>impudence</b>	An impudent statement. <i>His arrogance and <b>impudence</b> had offended many.</i>

<b>impudent</b>	Not showing due respect for another person; impertinent. <i>The student was kept in for <b>impudent</b> behavior.</i>
<b>indomitable</b>	Impossible to subdue or defeat. <i>A woman of <b>indomitable</b> spirit.</i>
<b>insolence</b>	The trait of being rude and impertinent; inclined to take liberties. <i>She was sacked for <b>insolence</b>.</i>
<u><b>insolent</b></u>	Marked by casual disrespect. <i>She hated the <b>insolent</b> tone of his voice.</i>
<u><b>manifest</b></u>	Record in a ship's manifest. <i><b>Manifest</b> disapproval.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. <i><b>Obvious</b> errors.</i>
<u><b>overt</b></u>	Open and observable; not secret or hidden. <i>An <b>overt</b> lie.</i>
<b>pert</b>	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>A <b>pert</b> slightly plump girl called Rose.</i>
<u><b>presumptuous</b></u>	Excessively forward. <i>The duchess would not put up with <b>presumptuous</b> servants.</i>
<b>proudly</b>	With a feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction in one's own achievements, qualities, or possessions or those of someone with whom one is closely associated. <i>Ray watched <b>proudly</b> from the sidelines as his son won the singles title.</i>
<b>shameless</b>	Feeling no shame. <i>A <b>shameless</b> imposter.</i>
<u><b>unashamed</b></u>	Used of persons or their behavior; feeling no shame. <i>An <b>unashamed</b> emotionalism.</i>
<b>uncivil</b>	Lacking civility or good manners. <i>Want nothing from you but to get away from your <b>uncivil</b> tongue.</i>
<b>unrepentant</b>	Not penitent or remorseful. <i>He was <b>unrepentant</b> and said that his comments were completely accurate.</i>
<b>upstart</b>	A person who has risen suddenly in rank or importance, especially one who behaves arrogantly. <i>The <b>upstarts</b> who dare to challenge the legitimacy of his rule.</i>
