## Associations of "Brazenly" (30 Words)

<a href="#">arrogant</a>	Having or revealing an exaggerated sense of one’s own importance or abilities. <i>A typically <b>arrogant</b> assumption.</i>
<b>audacious</b>	Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times. <i>A series of <b>audacious</b> takeovers.</i>
<b>barefaced</b>	Shameless and undisguised. <i>His years of working <b>barefaced</b> breathing down dust.</i>
<a href="#">blatant</a>	Conspicuously and offensively loud; given to vehement outcry. <i><b>Blatant</b> radios.</i>
<b>bold</b>	A bold typeface or letter. <i>Shadow cabinet members listed in <b>bold</b>.</i>
<a href="#">chutzpah</a>	Extreme self-confidence or audacity. <i>Love him or hate him you have to admire Cohen s <b>chutzpah</b>.</i>
<b>effrontery</b>	Insolent or impertinent behaviour. <i>One juror had the <b>effrontery</b> to challenge the coroner s decision.</i>
<a href="#">flaunt</a>	Dress or behave in a sexually provocative way. <i>Newly rich consumers eager to <b>flaunt</b> their prosperity.</i>
<a href="#">gall</a>	A digestive juice secreted by the liver and stored in the gallbladder aids in the digestion of fats. <i>The bank had the <b>gall</b> to demand a fee.</i>
<a href="#">glaring</a>	Staring fiercely or fixedly. <i>There is a <b>glaring</b> omission in the data.</i>
<b>ignorant</b>	Unaware because of a lack of relevant information or knowledge. <i>I had to walk out before I got <b>ignorant</b>.</i>
<b>impenitent</b>	Not penitent or remorseful. <i><b>Impenitent</b> elitists.</i>

<b>impertinence</b>	Inappropriate playfulness. <i>They gasped at the <b>impertinence</b> of the suggestion.</i>
<b><u>impertinent</u></b>	Not pertinent to a particular matter; irrelevant. <i>An <b>impertinent</b> question.</i>
<b>impudence</b>	The trait of being rude and impertinent; inclined to take liberties. <i>His arrogance and <b>impudence</b> had offended many.</i>
<b>impudent</b>	Not showing due respect for another person; impertinent. <i>The student was kept in for <b>impudent</b> behavior.</i>
<b>indomitable</b>	Impossible to subdue or defeat. <i>A woman of <b>indomitable</b> spirit.</i>
<b>insolence</b>	An offensive disrespectful impudent act. <i>She was sacked for <b>insolence</b>.</i>
<b><u>insolent</u></b>	Showing a rude and arrogant lack of respect. <i>The modern world with its quick material successes and <b>insolent</b> belief in the boundless possibilities of progress.</i>
<b><u>manifest</u></b>	Record in a ship's manifest. <i>Each passenger must be <b>manifested</b>.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived or understood; clear, self-evident, or apparent. <i>It was an <b>obvious</b> remark to make.</i>
<b><u>overt</u></b>	Open and observable; not secret or hidden. <i><b>Overt</b> hostility.</i>
<b>pert</b>	Characterized by a lightly pert and exuberant quality. <i>No need to be <b>pert</b> miss.</i>
<b><u>presumptuous</u></b>	Excessively forward. <i>The duchess would not put up with <b>presumptuous</b> servants.</i>
<b>proudly</b>	With a feeling of deep pleasure or satisfaction in one's own achievements, qualities, or possessions or those of someone with whom one is closely associated. <i>Ray watched <b>proudly</b> from the sidelines as his son won the singles title.</i>
<b>shameless</b>	(of a person or their conduct) characterized by or showing a lack of shame; barefaced or brazen. <i>A <b>shameless</b> imposter.</i>
<b><u>unashamed</u></b>	Expressed or acting openly and without guilt or embarrassment. <i>An <b>unashamed</b> emotionalism.</i>
<b>uncivil</b>	Lacking civility or good manners- Willa Cather. <i>He'd been short and <b>uncivil</b> with her.</i>

Not penitent or remorseful.

**unrepentant** *He was **unrepentant** and said that his comments were completely accurate.*

**upstart** Characteristic of someone who has risen economically or socially but lacks the social skills appropriate for this new position.

*The **upstarts** who dare to challenge the legitimacy of his rule.*
