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## Associations of "Breathy" (30 Words)

<b>airway</b>	The passage by which air reaches a person’s lungs. <i>He kept the man s <b>airway</b> clear and blood circulating.</i>
<b>asthma</b>	A respiratory condition marked by attacks of spasm in the bronchi of the lungs, causing difficulty in breathing. It is usually connected to allergic reaction or other forms of hypersensitivity.
<b><a href="#">breathe</a></b>	Be alive; remain living. <i>She <b>breathes</b> the Christian spirit.</i>
<b>breathing</b>	A sign in Greek or indicating the presence of an aspirate rough breathing or the absence of an aspirate smooth breathing at the beginning of a word. <i>The boy was disappointed to find only skeletons instead of living <b>breathing</b> dinosaurs.</i>
<b>cough</b>	A condition of the respiratory organs causing coughing. <i>The smoker <b>coughs</b> all day.</i>
<b><a href="#">emit</a></b>	Express audibly; utter sounds (not necessarily words). <i>Even the best cars <b>emit</b> carbon dioxide.</i>
<b>exhalation</b>	The process or action of exhaling. <i>He let his breath out in a long <b>exhalation</b> of relief.</i>
<b><a href="#">exhale</a></b>	Give out (breath or an odor). <i>He <b>exhaled</b> the smoke towards the ceiling.</i>
<b>expiration</b>	The exhalation of breath from the lungs. <i>At the end of <b>expiration</b> there is still a slight inflation in the lungs.</i>
<b>freshen</b>	Make (to feel) fresh. <i>The waitress <b>freshened</b> their coffee.</i>
<b>halitosis</b>	Offensive breath.
<b>inhale</b>	Draw in (air). <i>Later on I <b>inhale</b> a box of chocolate cookies while watching cable TV.</i>

<b>inhaler</b>	A portable device for administering a drug which is to be breathed in, used for relieving asthma and other bronchial or nasal congestion.
<b>lung</b>	Each of the pair of organs situated within the ribcage, consisting of elastic sacs with branching passages into which air is drawn, so that oxygen can pass into the blood and carbon dioxide be removed. Lungs are characteristic of vertebrates other than fish, though similar structures are present in some other animal groups. <i>The city had to be given <b>lungs</b> in the shape of open spaces squares parks and gardens.</i>
<b>nasal</b>	A nasal speech sound. <i>The <b>nasal</b> passages.</i>
<b>nostril</b>	Either one of the two external openings to the nasal cavity in the nose.
<b>oxygen</b>	A nonmetallic bivalent element that is normally a colorless odorless tasteless nonflammable diatomic gas; constitutes 21 percent of the atmosphere by volume; the most abundant element in the earth's crust. <i>An <b>oxygen</b> supply.</i>
<b>pant</b>	Utter while panting as if out of breath. <i>We ll never have time she <b>panted</b>.</i>
<b>puff</b>	A light inflated pastry or puff shell. <i>A <b>puff</b> of wind swung the weathercock round.</i>
<b>refresh</b>	Refresh one s memory. <i><b>Refresh</b> the screen frequently to make mistakes easier to identify.</i>
<b>respiration</b>	The action of breathing. <i>Opiates affect <b>respiration</b>.</i>
<b>respire</b>	Recover hope, courage, or strength after a time of difficulty. <i>Lichens <b>respire</b> at lower levels of temperature and moisture.</i>
<b>resuscitate</b>	Make (something) active or vigorous again. <i>An ambulance crew tried to <b>resuscitate</b> him.</i>
<b>resuscitated</b>	Restored to life or consciousness.
<b>scuba</b>	Scuba diving. <i><b>Scuba</b> gear.</i>
<b>smoke</b>	Cure or preserve food especially meat or fish by exposure to smoke. <i>You re going to buy some <b>smokes</b> of your own.</i>
<b>sniff</b>	An amount of air or other substance taken up by sniffing. <i>The Olympic hosts will at least get a <b>sniff</b> at a medal.</i>
<b>stifler</b>	A person who stifles or smothers or suppresses. <i>He is a real conversation <b>stifler</b>.</i>
