economy of language An act of economizing; reduction in cost.		
ephemerality	The property of lasting for a very short time.	
impermanence	The state or fact of lasting for only a limited period of time. She describes the <b>impermanence</b> of human existence.	
incisiveness	Keenness and forcefulness of thought or expression or intellect.	
pith	The choicest or most essential or most vital part of some idea or experience. The <b>pith</b> and core of socialism.	
pithiness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.	
shortness	The quality of lasting a small amount of time. I apologize for the <b>shortness</b> of this letter.	
succinctness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.	
transience	The attribute of being brief or fleeting. The <b>transience</b> of life and happiness.	
transitoriness	An impermanence that suggests the inevitability of ending or dying.

# Associations of "Brevity" (30 Words)

abbreviate	Shorten. Network is often <b>abbreviate</b> d to net.
abbreviated	Very short. The <b>abbreviated</b> speech.
abbreviation	A shortened form of a word or phrase. Nursing records must be written without <b>abbreviation</b> .



<u>brief</u>	Instruct a barrister by brief. A pair of extremely <b>brief</b> black shorts.
<u>clarity</u>	The quality of clear water. When she awoke the <b>clarity</b> was back in her eyes.
<u>concise</u>	Giving a lot of information clearly and in a few words; brief but comprehensive. A <b>concise</b> explanation.
conciseness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
ephemeral	An ephemeral plant. The <b>ephemeral</b> joys of childhood.
<u>fleeting</u>	Lasting for a very short time. A <b>fleeting</b> glance.
illusive	Deceptive; illusory. An <b>illusive</b> haven.
illusory	Based on or having the nature of an illusion. Secret activities offer presidents the alluring but often <b>illusory</b> promise that they can achieve foreign policy goals without the bothersome debate and open decision that are staples of democracy.
interlude	Perform an interlude. Short instrumental <b>interlude</b> s between songs.
laconic	Brief and to the point; effectively cut short. <i>The laconic reply yes.</i>
layover	A brief stay in the course of a journey. There was only a forty eight minute <b>layover</b> .
<u>mortality</u>	Death, especially on a large scale. The causes of <b>mortality</b> among infants and young children.
overview	A general summary of a subject. A brief <b>overview</b> of the survey.
pithiness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
<u>pithy</u>	Concise and full of meaning- Hervey Allen. Welcomed her <b>pithy</b> comments.
provisional	A provisional stamp. A <b>provisional</b> government.



sententious	Abounding in or given to pompous or aphoristic moralizing. <i>Too often the significant episode deteriorates into sententious</i> <i>conversation.</i>
short	Marked by rude or peremptory shortness. You go deep and you go <b>short</b> .
<u>succinct</u>	Briefly giving the gist of something. <i>Succinct</i> comparisons.
succinctness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
temporary	A person employed on a temporary basis typically an office worker who finds employment through an agency. <i>A temporary job.</i>
<u>terse</u>	Brief and to the point; effectively cut short. Short and <b>terse</b> and easy to understand.
transience	The state or fact of lasting only for a short time; transitoriness. The <b>transience</b> of life and happiness.
<u>transient</u>	Lasting a very short time. <i>Transient</i> laborers.
transitional	Relating to or characteristic of a process or period of transition. A <b>transitional</b> government was appointed.
transitory	Lasting a very short time. <i>Transitory</i> periods of medieval greatness.
truncate	Shorten by cutting off the top or end. A <b>truncate</b> d pyramid.
