briefness	A document stating the facts and points of law of a client’s case.
compactness	A small cosmetics case with a mirror; to be carried in a woman’s purse. <i>He is known for the brevity and compactness of his prose.</i>
compression	The action of compressing or being compressed.
conciseness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.

concision	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
crispness	A pleasing firmness and freshness. <i>Crispness of fresh lettuce.</i>
economy of language	An act of economizing; reduction in cost.
ephemerality	The property of lasting for a very short time.
impermanence	The state or fact of lasting for only a limited period of time. <i>She describes the impermanence of human existence.</i>
incisiveness	Keeness and forcefulness of thought or expression or intellect.
pith	The choicest or most essential or most vital part of some idea or experience. <i>The pith and core of socialism.</i>
pithiness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
shortness	The quality of lasting a small amount of time. <i>I apologize for the shortness of this letter.</i>
succinctness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
transience	The attribute of being brief or fleeting. <i>The transience of life and happiness.</i>
transitoriness	An impermanence that suggests the inevitability of ending or dying.

- *The brevity of human life.*
- *For brevity, it is worth using these little symbols.*

abbreviate	Shorten. <i>Network is often abbreviated to net.</i>
abbreviated	Very short. <i>The abbreviated speech.</i>
abbreviation	A shortened form of a word or phrase. <i>Nursing records must be written without abbreviation.</i>

brief	Instruct a barrister by brief. <i>A pair of extremely brief black shorts.</i>
clarity	The quality of clear water. <i>When she awoke the clarity was back in her eyes.</i>
concise	Giving a lot of information clearly and in a few words; brief but comprehensive. <i>A concise explanation.</i>
conciseness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
ephemeral	An ephemeral plant. <i>The ephemeral joys of childhood.</i>
fleeting	Lasting for a very short time. <i>A fleeting glance.</i>
illusive	Deceptive; illusory. <i>An illusive haven.</i>
illusory	Based on or having the nature of an illusion. <i>Secret activities offer presidents the alluring but often illusory promise that they can achieve foreign policy goals without the bothersome debate and open decision that are staples of democracy.</i>
interlude	Perform an interlude. <i>Short instrumental interludes between songs.</i>
laconic	Brief and to the point; effectively cut short. <i>The laconic reply yes.</i>
layover	A brief stay in the course of a journey. <i>There was only a forty eight minute layover.</i>
mortality	Death, especially on a large scale. <i>The causes of mortality among infants and young children.</i>
overview	A general summary of a subject. <i>A brief overview of the survey.</i>
pithiness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
pithy	Concise and full of meaning- Hervey Allen. <i>Welcomed her pithy comments.</i>
provisional	A provisional stamp. <i>A provisional government.</i>

sententious	Abounding in or given to pompous or aphoristic moralizing. <i>Too often the significant episode deteriorates into sententious conversation.</i>
short	Marked by rude or peremptory shortness. <i>You go deep and you go short.</i>
succinct	Briefly giving the gist of something. <i>Succinct comparisons.</i>
succinctness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
temporary	A person employed on a temporary basis typically an office worker who finds employment through an agency. <i>A temporary job.</i>
terse	Brief and to the point; effectively cut short. <i>Short and terse and easy to understand.</i>
transience	The state or fact of lasting only for a short time; transitoriness. <i>The transience of life and happiness.</i>
transient	Lasting a very short time. <i>Transient laborers.</i>
transitional	Relating to or characteristic of a process or period of transition. <i>A transitional government was appointed.</i>
transitory	Lasting a very short time. <i>Transitory periods of medieval greatness.</i>
truncate	Shorten by cutting off the top or end. <i>A truncated pyramid.</i>
