- Someone who brews beer or ale from malt and hops and water.





Synonyms of "Brewer" as a noun (1 Word)

beer maker A general name for alcoholic beverages made by fermenting a cereal (or mixture of cereals) flavored with hops.

Associations of "Brewer" (30 Words)

alcohol	Drink containing alcohol. The use of petrol containing alcohol .
<u>beer</u>	An alcoholic drink made from yeast-fermented malt flavoured with hops. A beer bottle.
<u>beverage</u>	(chiefly in commercial use) a drink other than water. May I take your beverage order.
<u>cafe</u>	A small restaurant selling light meals and drinks.
carouse	Engage in boisterous, drunken merrymaking. They danced and carouse d until the drink ran out.
cocktail	An appetizer served as a first course at a meal. A chilled lobster cocktail prettily presented in a martini glass.



coffee	A hot drink made from the roasted and ground seeds coffee beans of a tropical shrub. A maxi dress in cream with a coffee silk trim.
drink	Drink excessive amounts of alcohol be an alcoholic. A table covered with food and drink .
drinker	A person who drinks a particular drink. A heavy drinker .
gin	Separate the seeds from cotton with a cotton gin. <i>Gin game.</i>
gulp	An act of gulping food or drink. I took a gulp of beer.
guzzle	Eat or drink (something) greedily. <i>This car guzzles petrol.</i>
<u>inebriated</u>	Drunk; intoxicated. Helplessly inebriated .
juice	A drink made from fruit or vegetable juice. <i>Juice</i> one orange at a time.
kava	An alcoholic drink made from the aromatic roots of the kava shrub.
lemonade	A sweet colourless carbonated drink containing lemon flavouring. <i>The butler served her a lemonade</i> .
liquor	Steep (something, especially malt) in water. <i>Waste liquors.</i>
<u>mug</u>	The human face kisser and smiler and mug are informal terms for face and phiz is British. <i>She picked up her coffee mug.</i>
quaff	A hearty draft. Porter is a dark malty quaff .
<u>revelry</u>	Lively and noisy festivities, especially when these involve drinking a large amount of alcohol. Sounds of revelry issued into the night.
rice	Force cooked potatoes or other vegetables through a sieve or ricer. <i>Rice</i> the potatoes.
<u>sake</u>	The purpose of achieving or obtaining. New ideas amount to change for change s sake .
scotch	Render (something regarded as dangerous) temporarily harmless. Feudal power in France was scotch ed though far from killed.



vino wine	Wine, especially that which is cheap or of inferior quality. Treat to wine. <i>The regional foods and wines of France.</i>
tea	Drink tea or take afternoon tea. <i>Herbal tea</i> .
swill	Wash or rinse out (an area or container) by pouring large amounts of water or other liquid over or into it. The icy water swill ed round us.
stein	A large earthenware beer mug.
<u>sip</u>	Drink in sips. I sat sip ping coffee.
