## **Brewer as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Brewer" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “brewer” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A person or company that manufactures beer.*
- *Drink made by steeping and boiling and fermenting rather than distilling.*
- *The owner or manager of a brewery.*
- *Someone who brews beer or ale from malt and hops and water.*



### **Synonyms of "Brewer" as a noun (1 Word)**

**beer maker** A general name for alcoholic beverages made by fermenting a cereal (or mixture of cereals) flavored with hops.

- alcohol** Drink containing alcohol.  
*The use of petrol containing **alcohol**.*
- beer** An alcoholic drink made from yeast-fermented malt flavoured with hops.  
*A **beer** bottle.*
- beverage** (chiefly in commercial use) a drink other than water.  
*May I take your **beverage** order.*
- cafe** A small restaurant selling light meals and drinks.
- carouse** Engage in boisterous, drunken merrymaking.  
*They danced and **caroused** until the drink ran out.*
- cocktail** An appetizer served as a first course at a meal.  
*A chilled lobster **cocktail** prettily presented in a martini glass.*

<b>coffee</b>	A hot drink made from the roasted and ground seeds coffee beans of a tropical shrub. <i>A maxi dress in cream with a <b>coffee</b> silk trim.</i>
<b>drink</b>	Drink excessive amounts of alcohol be an alcoholic. <i>A table covered with food and <b>drink</b>.</i>
<b>drinker</b>	A person who drinks a particular drink. <i>A heavy <b>drinker</b>.</i>
<b>gin</b>	Separate the seeds from cotton with a cotton gin. <i><b>Gin</b> game.</i>
<b>gulp</b>	An act of gulping food or drink. <i>I took a <b>gulp</b> of beer.</i>
<b>guzzle</b>	Eat or drink (something) greedily. <i>This car <b>guzzles</b> petrol.</i>
<b><u>inebriated</u></b>	Drunk; intoxicated. <i>Helplessly <b>inebriated</b>.</i>
<b>juice</b>	A drink made from fruit or vegetable juice. <i><b>Juice</b> one orange at a time.</i>
<b>kava</b>	An alcoholic drink made from the aromatic roots of the kava shrub.
<b>lemonade</b>	A sweet colourless carbonated drink containing lemon flavouring. <i>The butler served her a <b>lemonade</b>.</i>
<b>liquor</b>	Steep (something, especially malt) in water. <i>Waste <b>liquors</b>.</i>
<b><u>mug</u></b>	The human face kisser and smiler and mug are informal terms for face and phiz is British. <i>She picked up her coffee <b>mug</b>.</i>
<b>quaff</b>	A hearty draft. <i>Porter is a dark malty <b>quaff</b>.</i>
<b><u>revelry</u></b>	Lively and noisy festivities, especially when these involve drinking a large amount of alcohol. <i>Sounds of <b>revelry</b> issued into the night.</i>
<b>rice</b>	Force cooked potatoes or other vegetables through a sieve or ricer. <i><b>Rice</b> the potatoes.</i>
<b><u>sake</u></b>	The purpose of achieving or obtaining. <i>New ideas amount to change for change s <b>sake</b>.</i>
<b>scotch</b>	Render (something regarded as dangerous) temporarily harmless. <i>Feudal power in France was <b>scotched</b> though far from killed.</i>



- sip** Drink in sips.  
*I sat **sipping** coffee.*
- stein** A large earthenware beer mug.
- swill** Wash or rinse out (an area or container) by pouring large amounts of water or other liquid over or into it.  
*The icy water **swilled** round us.*
- tea** Drink tea or take afternoon tea.  
*Herbal **tea**.*
- vino** Wine, especially that which is cheap or of inferior quality.
- wine** Treat to wine.  
*The regional foods and **wines** of France.*
