# Associations of "Brewer" (30 Words)

alcohol	Drink containing alcohol. The use of petrol containing <b>alcohol</b> .
<u>beer</u>	An alcoholic drink made from yeast-fermented malt flavoured with hops. A <b>beer</b> bottle.
<u>beverage</u>	(chiefly in commercial use) a drink other than water. May I take your <b>beverage</b> order.
<u>cafe</u>	A small restaurant selling light meals and drinks.
carouse	Engage in boisterous, drunken merrymaking. They danced and <b>carouse</b> d until the drink ran out.
cocktail	An appetizer served as a first course at a meal. A chilled lobster <b>cocktail</b> prettily presented in a martini glass.



coffee	A hot drink made from the roasted and ground seeds coffee beans of a tropical shrub. A maxi dress in cream with a <b>coffee</b> silk trim.
drink	Drink excessive amounts of alcohol be an alcoholic. A table covered with food and <b>drink</b> .
drinker	A person who drinks a particular drink. A heavy <b>drinker</b> .
gin	Separate the seeds from cotton with a cotton gin. <i>Gin game.</i>
gulp	An act of gulping food or drink. I took a <b>gulp</b> of beer.
guzzle	Eat or drink (something) greedily. <i>This car <b>guzzle</b>s petrol.</i>
<u>inebriated</u>	Drunk; intoxicated. Helplessly <b>inebriated</b> .
juice	A drink made from fruit or vegetable juice. <i>Juice</i> one orange at a time.
kava	An alcoholic drink made from the aromatic roots of the kava shrub.
lemonade	A sweet colourless carbonated drink containing lemon flavouring. <i>The butler served her a <b>lemonade</b></i> .
liquor	Steep (something, especially malt) in water. <i>Waste <b>liquor</b>s.</i>
<u>mug</u>	The human face kisser and smiler and mug are informal terms for face and phiz is British. <i>She picked up her coffee <b>mug</b>.</i>
quaff	A hearty draft. Porter is a dark malty <b>quaff</b> .
<u>revelry</u>	Lively and noisy festivities, especially when these involve drinking a large amount of alcohol. Sounds of <b>revelry</b> issued into the night.
rice	Force cooked potatoes or other vegetables through a sieve or ricer. <i>Rice</i> the potatoes.
<u>sake</u>	The purpose of achieving or obtaining. New ideas amount to change for change s <b>sake</b> .
scotch	Render (something regarded as dangerous) temporarily harmless. Feudal power in France was <b>scotch</b> ed though far from killed.



vino wine	Wine, especially that which is cheap or of inferior quality. Treat to wine. <i>The regional foods and wines of France.</i>
tea	Drink tea or take afternoon tea. <i>Herbal <b>tea</b></i> .
swill	Wash or rinse out (an area or container) by pouring large amounts of water or other liquid over or into it. The icy water <b>swill</b> ed round us.
stein	A large earthenware beer mug.
<u>sip</u>	Drink in sips. I sat <b>sip</b> ping coffee.
