<b><a href="#">bachelor</a></b>	Lead a bachelor's existence. <i>One of the country's most eligible <b>bachelors</b>.</i>
<b>bigamist</b>	Someone who marries one person while already legally married to another.
<b>bigamy</b>	The offense of marrying someone while you have a living spouse from whom no valid divorce has occurred.
<b>bridal</b>	Of or pertaining to a bride. <i>Her white <b>bridal</b> gown.</i>
<b>bridegroom</b>	A man on his wedding day or just before and after the event.
<b>cohabit</b>	Exist together. <i>An increasing number of couples are <b>cohabiting</b>.</i>
<b>conjoin</b>	Take in marriage. <i>An approach which <b>conjoins</b> theory and method.</i>

<b>consummate</b>	Complete (a transaction). <i>Consummate happiness.</i>
<b><u>couple</u></b>	A pair of rafters. <i>A <b>couple</b> of girls were playing marbles.</i>
<b>dowry</b>	An amount of property or money brought by a bride to her husband on their marriage. <i>Elizabeth s <b>dowry</b> was to be 45 000 in diamonds.</i>
<b>endogamy</b>	The fusion of reproductive cells from related individuals; inbreeding; self-pollination.
<b><u>groom</u></b>	A bridegroom. <i>He is <b>grooming</b> his son to become his successor.</i>
<b>honeymoon</b>	Spend a honeymoon. <i>They flew to the West Indies on <b>honeymoon</b>.</i>
<b>marital</b>	Of or relating to the state of marriage. <i>She wanted to talk about their <b>marital</b> problems.</i>
<b>marriage</b>	(in bezique and other card games) a combination of a king and queen of the same suit. <i>They were celebrating 50 years of <b>marriage</b>.</i>
<b>married</b>	Married people. <i><b>Married</b> bliss.</i>
<b>marry</b>	Perform a marriage ceremony. <i>Most Chardonnays don t <b>marry</b> well with salmon.</i>
<b>matrimony</b>	The state of being a married couple voluntarily joined for life (or until divorce). <i>The joys of <b>matrimony</b>.</i>
<b>newlywed</b>	Someone recently married.
<b>nuptial</b>	Of or relating to a wedding. <i>Moments of <b>nuptial</b> bliss.</i>
<b><u>partner</u></b>	Associate or work together as partners. <i>He began to call potential coalition <b>partners</b> about forming a new government.</i>
<b>polygamist</b>	A person who has more than one wife or husband at the same time. <i>A Mississippi based group of practising <b>polygamists</b>.</i>
<b>preen</b>	(of a bird) tidy and clean its feathers with its beak. <i>The pigeon <b>preened</b> her feathers.</i>
<b>prenuptial</b>	Relating to events before a marriage. <i><b>Prenuptial</b> pregnancy.</i>

<b>raiment</b>	Especially fine or decorative clothing. <i>Ladies clothed in <b>raiment</b> bedecked with jewels.</i>
<b>spouse</b>	A person's partner in marriage.
<b>suitor</b>	A man who courts a woman. <i>She decided to marry her <b>suitor</b>.</i>
<b>wed</b>	Get married. <i>The government was <b>wedded</b> to budgetary orthodoxy.</i>
<b>wedding</b>	A party of people at a wedding.
<b>wife</b>	The wife of a person with a specified occupation. <i>He and his <b>wife</b> are keen gardeners.</i>
