| marital | Of or relating to the state of marriage. <i>She wanted to talk about their marital problems.</i> |
| marriage | (in bezique and other card games) a combination of a king and queen of the same suit. <i>They were celebrating 50 years of marriage.</i> |
| married | Married people. <i>Married bliss.</i> |
| marry | Perform a marriage ceremony. <i>Most Chardonnays don t marry well with salmon.</i> |
| matrimony | The state of being a married couple voluntarily joined for life (or until divorce). <i>The joys of matrimony.</i> |
| newlywed | Someone recently married. |
| nuptial | Of or relating to a wedding. <i>Moments of nuptial bliss.</i> |
| <u>partner</u> | Associate or work together as partners. <i>He began to call potential coalition partners about forming a new government.</i> |
| polygamist | A person who has more than one wife or husband at the same time. <i>A Mississippi based group of practising polygamists.</i> |
| preen | (of a bird) tidy and clean its feathers with its beak. <i>The pigeon preened her feathers.</i> |
| prenuptial | Relating to events before a marriage. <i>Prenuptial pregnancy.</i> |
