<b>become brighter</b>	Enhance the appearance of.
<b>buoy up</b>	Keep afloat.
<b>cast light on</b>	Move about aimlessly or without any destination, often in search of food or employment.
<b>cheer up</b>	Become cheerful.
<b>clear</b>	Grant authorization or clearance for. <i>McAllister's lob was <b>cleared</b> off the line by Kernaghan.</i>
<b>clear up</b>	Settle, as of a debt.
<b>embellish</b>	Add details to. <i>Blue silk <b>embellished</b> with golden embroidery.</i>
<b>enhance</b>	Increase. <i>This sauce will <b>enhance</b> the flavor of the meat.</i>

<b>enrich</b>	Improve or enhance the quality or value of. <i>Top party members had <b>enriched</b> themselves.</i>
<b>freshen</b>	Become or make oneself fresh again. <i>She <b>freshened</b> up after the tennis game.</i>
<b>illuminate</b>	Make free from confusion or ambiguity; make clear. <i>A flash of lightning <b>illuminated</b> the house.</i>
<b>illumine</b>	Light up; brighten. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was <b>illumined</b>.</i>
<b>irradiate</b>	Illuminate (something) by or as if by shining light on it. <i><b>Irradiate</b> food.</i>
<b>light up</b>	To come to rest, settle.
<b>lighten</b>	Reduce the weight on; make lighter. <i><b>Lighten</b> the burden of caring for her elderly parents.</i>
<b>lighten up</b>	Reduce the weight on; make lighter.
<b>make bright</b>	Induce to have sex.
<b>make brighter</b>	Form by assembling individuals or constituents.
<b>make more attractive</b>	Make or cause to be or to become.
<b>perk up</b>	Raise.
<b>rally</b>	Drive in a rally. <i>We re driving off to Spain to <b>rally</b>.</i>
<b>shed light on</b>	Cast off hair, skin, horn, or feathers.
<b>throw light on</b>	Convey or communicate; of a smile, a look, a physical gesture.
<b>wake up</b>	Arouse or excite feelings and passions.



## Usage Examples of "Brighten" as a verb

- *Daffodils brighten up many gardens and parks.*
- *Sarah brightened up considerably as she thought of Emily's words.*
- *Most of the country should brighten up later.*
- *The paint will brighten the room.*
- *She seems to brighten his life.*
- *The fire began to blaze fiercely, brightening the room.*



## Associations of "Brighten" (30 Words)

<b>beam</b>	An oscillating shaft which transmits the vertical piston movement of a beam engine to the crank or pump. <i>A compulsory set of exercises on floor vault bars and <b>beam</b>.</i>
<b>bright</b>	Made smooth and bright by or as if by rubbing reflecting a sheen or glow. <i>These young people have a <b>bright</b> future ahead of them.</i>
<b>brightly</b>	In a cheerful and lively way. <i><b>Brightly</b> painted fingernails.</i>
<b>brightness</b>	The quality of being vividly and boldly coloured. <i>The <b>brightness</b> of a winter s day.</i>
<b>brilliance</b>	Intense brightness of light. <i>Lapis lazuli was highly regarded for the <b>brilliance</b> of its colour.</i>
<b>brilliantly</b>	In an extremely intelligent way. <i>The <b>brilliantly</b> hued orchid.</i>

<b>comet</b>	A celestial object consisting of a nucleus of ice and dust and, when near the sun, a 'tail' of gas and dust particles pointing away from the sun.
<b>dazzling</b>	Extremely bright, especially so as to blind the eyes temporarily. <i>The sunlight was <b>dazzling</b>.</i>
<b>effulgence</b>	The quality of being bright and sending out rays of light.
<b>flash</b>	A newsflash. <i>She <b>flashed</b> him a withering look.</i>
<b>glimmer</b>	A flash of light (especially reflected light). <i>He saw a faint <b>glimmer</b> of light from her window.</i>
<b>gloss</b>	Apply a glossy substance to. <i>The pebble dash of the walls was <b>glossed</b> white.</i>
<b>glow</b>	Have a complexion with a strong bright color, such as red or pink. <i>The fireflies were <b>glowing</b> and flying about in the garden.</i>
<b>illuminate</b>	Make lighter or brighter. <i>This is a carefully written large format manuscript <b>illuminated</b> by Leonardo Bellini.</i>
<b>illumine</b>	Light up; brighten. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was <b>illuminated</b>.</i>
<b>light</b>	Characterized by or emitting light. <i>A <b>light</b> lilting voice like a silver bell.</i>
<b>lighten</b>	Make or become lighter in weight, pressure, or severity. <i>The room <b>lightened</b> up.</i>
<b>lightness</b>	Having a light color. <i>The <b>lightness</b> of her silky hair.</i>
<b>limelight</b>	A lamp consisting of a flame directed at a cylinder of lime with a lens to concentrate the light; formerly used for stage lighting. <i>He enjoyed being in the <b>limelight</b>.</i>
<b>luminosity</b>	The intrinsic brightness of a celestial object (as distinct from its apparent brightness diminished by distance). <i>Acrylic colours retain freshness and <b>luminosity</b>.</i>
<b>lunar</b>	Of or relating to or associated with the moon. <i>A <b>lunar</b> landscape.</i>
<b>luster</b>	The visual property of something that shines with reflected light.
<b>opalescence</b>	The visual property of something having a milky brightness and a play of colors from the surface.
<b>polish</b>	A preparation used in polishing. <i>The machine refines the shape of the stone and gives it <b>polish</b>.</i>

<b>radiance</b>	The amount of electromagnetic radiation leaving or arriving at a point on a surface. <i>The <b>radiance</b> of her countenance.</i>
<b>shine</b>	Make a surface shine. <i>His shoes were <b>shined</b> to perfection.</i>
<u>sky</u>	Heaven; heavenly power. <i>Hundreds of stars were shining in the <b>sky</b>.</i>
<u>star</u>	Feature as the star. <i>The movie <b>stars</b> Dustin Hoffman as an autistic man.</i>
<b>sunlight</b>	Light from the sun. <i>A shaft of <b>sunlight</b>.</i>
<u>twinkle</u>	Gleam or glow intermittently. <i>The lights <b>twinkled</b> in the distance.</i>
