become bright	Enhance the appearance of.
become brighter	Enhance the appearance of.
buoy up	Keep afloat.
cast light on	Move about aimlessly or without any destination, often in search of food or employment.
cheer up	Become cheerful.
clear	Grant authorization or clearance for. <i>McAllister's lob was cleared off the line by Kernaghan.</i>
clear up	Settle, as of a debt.
embellish	Add details to. <i>Blue silk embellished with golden embroidery.</i>
enhance	Increase. <i>This sauce will enhance the flavor of the meat.</i>

enrich	Improve or enhance the quality or value of. <i>Top party members had enriched themselves.</i>
freshen	Become or make oneself fresh again. <i>She freshened up after the tennis game.</i>
illuminate	Make free from confusion or ambiguity; make clear. <i>A flash of lightning illuminated the house.</i>
illumine	Light up; brighten. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was illumined.</i>
irradiate	Illuminate (something) by or as if by shining light on it. <i>Irradiate food.</i>
light up	To come to rest, settle.
lighten	Reduce the weight on; make lighter. <i>Lighten the burden of caring for her elderly parents.</i>
lighten up	Reduce the weight on; make lighter.
make bright	Induce to have sex.
make brighter	Form by assembling individuals or constituents.
make more attractive	Make or cause to be or to become.
perk up	Raise.
rally	Drive in a rally. <i>We re driving off to Spain to rally.</i>
shed light on	Cast off hair, skin, horn, or feathers.
throw light on	Convey or communicate; of a smile, a look, a physical gesture.
wake up	Arouse or excite feelings and passions.



Usage Examples of "Brighten" as a verb

- *Sarah brightened up considerably as she thought of Emily's words.*
- *Most of the country should brighten up later.*
- *The paint will brighten the room.*
- *She seems to brighten his life.*

beam

An oscillating shaft which transmits the vertical piston movement of a beam engine to the crank or pump.

*A compulsory set of exercises on floor vault bars and **beam**.*

bright

Made smooth and bright by or as if by rubbing reflecting a sheen or glow.

*These young people have a **bright** future ahead of them.*

brightly

In a cheerful and lively way.

***Brightly** painted fingernails.*

brightness

The quality of being vividly and boldly coloured.

*The **brightness** of a winter's day.*

brilliance

Intense brightness of light.

*Lapis lazuli was highly regarded for the **brilliance** of its colour.*

brilliantly

In an extremely intelligent way.

*The **brilliantly** hued orchid.*

comet	A celestial object consisting of a nucleus of ice and dust and, when near the sun, a 'tail' of gas and dust particles pointing away from the sun.
dazzling	Extremely bright, especially so as to blind the eyes temporarily. <i>The sunlight was dazzling.</i>
effulgence	The quality of being bright and sending out rays of light.
flash	A newsflash. <i>She flashed him a withering look.</i>
glimmer	A flash of light (especially reflected light). <i>He saw a faint glimmer of light from her window.</i>
gloss	Apply a glossy substance to. <i>The pebble dash of the walls was glossed white.</i>
glow	Have a complexion with a strong bright color, such as red or pink. <i>The fireflies were glowing and flying about in the garden.</i>
illuminate	Make lighter or brighter. <i>This is a carefully written large format manuscript illuminated by Leonardo Bellini.</i>
illumine	Light up; brighten. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was illuminated.</i>
light	Characterized by or emitting light. <i>A light lilting voice like a silver bell.</i>
lighten	Make or become lighter in weight, pressure, or severity. <i>The room lightened up.</i>
lightness	Having a light color. <i>The lightness of her silky hair.</i>
limelight	A lamp consisting of a flame directed at a cylinder of lime with a lens to concentrate the light; formerly used for stage lighting. <i>He enjoyed being in the limelight.</i>
luminosity	The intrinsic brightness of a celestial object (as distinct from its apparent brightness diminished by distance). <i>Acrylic colours retain freshness and luminosity.</i>
lunar	Of or relating to or associated with the moon. <i>A lunar landscape.</i>
luster	The visual property of something that shines with reflected light.
opalescence	The visual property of something having a milky brightness and a play of colors from the surface.
polish	A preparation used in polishing. <i>The machine refines the shape of the stone and gives it polish.</i>

radiance	The amount of electromagnetic radiation leaving or arriving at a point on a surface. <i>The radiance of her countenance.</i>
shine	Make a surface shine. <i>His shoes were shined to perfection.</i>
<u>sky</u>	Heaven; heavenly power. <i>Hundreds of stars were shining in the sky.</i>
<u>star</u>	Feature as the star. <i>The movie stars Dustin Hoffman as an autistic man.</i>
sunlight	Light from the sun. <i>A shaft of sunlight.</i>
<u>twinkle</u>	Gleam or glow intermittently. <i>The lights twinkled in the distance.</i>
