- The quality or state of being well lit.
- The quality or state of giving out or reflecting light.
- The quality of being luminous; emitting or reflecting light.
- The location of a visual perception along a continuum from black to white.
- Success and happiness.
- The quality in sound of being clear, vibrant, and typically high-pitched.
- The quality of being cheerful or lively.





## Synonyms of "Brightness" as a noun (7 Words)

brightness level	The location of a visual perception along a continuum from black to white.
cleverness	The quality of being clever; intelligence or shrewdness. <i>The cleverness of her strategy.</i>
light	A traffic light. A <b>light</b> came on in his room.
luminance	The quality of being luminous; emitting or reflecting light.
luminosity	The rate of emission of radiation, visible or otherwise. Altair has ten times the <b>luminosity</b> of the sun.
luminousness	The quality of being luminous; emitting or reflecting light.
<u>smartness</u>	Elegance by virtue of being fashionable. The <b>smartness</b> of the pace soon exhausted him.

# Associations of "Brightness" (30 Words)

<u>bright</u>	Made smooth and bright by or as if by rubbing reflecting a sheen or glow. The <b>bright</b> green leaves.
<u>brighten</u>	Become clear. Most of the country should <b>brighten</b> up later.
brightly	In a way that is characterized by having vivid colours. A very <b>brightly</b> patterned floral jumper.
brilliance	Exceptional talent or intelligence. <i>He s played the stock market with great</i> <b>brilliance</b> .
brilliantly	In an extremely intelligent way. <i>The stars shone <b>brilliantly</b>.</i>
burnish	The shine on a highly polished surface. To <b>burnish</b> copper I would probably use a drill with a pad attached to the end.
<u>dazzling</u>	Extremely impressive, beautiful, or skilful. <i>The sunlight was <b>dazzling</b></i> .



effulgence	The quality of being bright and sending out rays of light.
enamel	A work of art executed in enamel. A dagger inlaid with bone and <b>enamel</b> s.
furbish	Give a fresh look to (something old or shabby); renovate. <i>Old arms duly <b>furbish</b>ed.</i>
glimmer	A faint or wavering light. There is one <b>glimmer</b> of hope for Becky.
gloss	Apply a glossy substance to. The pebble dash of the walls was <b>gloss</b> ed white.
glossy	Having a surface made smooth and glossy especially by pressing between rollers. <i>The horse s glossy coat.</i>
lacquer	The sap of the lacquer tree used as a varnish. Rows of peroxide curls rigid with <b>lacquer</b> .
light	Mental understanding as an enlightening experience. A <b>light</b> comedy.
<u>lightness</u>	The trait of being lighthearted and frivolous. The <b>lightness</b> of my skin.
luminescence	Light from nonthermal sources. Honey fungus produces a ghostly greenish <b>luminescence</b> .
luminosity	The quality of being luminous; emitting or reflecting light. Altair has ten times the <b>luminosity</b> of the sun.
luster	A quality that outshines the usual.
opalescence	The visual property of something having a milky brightness and a play of colors from the surface.
phosphorescent	Emitting light without appreciable heat as by slow oxidation of phosphorous. The <b>phosphorescent</b> glow of decaying wood.
polish	A preparation used in polishing. <i>After you and your editor have</i> <b>polish</b> <i>ed the manuscript the copyeditors</i> <i>read it.</i>
radiance	An attractive combination of good health and happiness. The <b>radiance</b> of the sunset dwindled and died.
radiant	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. He praised her <b>radiant</b> self confidence.



sheen	A soft lustre on a surface. Her black hair <b>sheen</b> ed in the sun.
shine	Make a surface shine. His shoes were <b>shine</b> d to perfection.
shining	Giving out or reflecting bright light. He has set a <b>shining</b> example with his model behaviour.
<u>shiny</u>	Having a shiny surface or coating. <i>Shiny</i> black patents.
<u>twinkle</u>	Gleam or glow intermittently. There s a perpetual <b>twinkle</b> in his eyes.
varnish	Apply varnish to. They <b>varnish</b> ed over their vices and exaggerated their merit.
