## Associations of "Bring back" (30 Words)

anachronism	The action of attributing something to a period to which it does not belong. The town is a throwback to medieval times an <b>anachronism</b> that has survived the passing years.
backslide	Drop to a lower level, as in one's morals or standards. There are many things that can cause slimmers to <b>backslide</b> .
backward	(of a fielding position) behind an imaginary line passing through the stumps at the batsman's end at right angles to the wicket. <i>An economically <b>backward</b> country.</i>
backwards	(of a movement) in the direction of one's back. A step <b>backwards</b> for the economy.
behind	A kick that sends the ball over a behind line or a touch that sends it between the inner posts scoring one point. <i>England were still 382 runs behind</i> .
come	Come to pass arrive as in due course. Melons <b>come</b> from a vine.
degeneracy	The state of being degenerate in mental or moral qualities. Moral <b>degeneracy</b> followed intellectual degeneration.
degeneration	The state of being degenerate in mental or moral qualities. Overgrazing has caused serious <b>degeneration</b> of grassland.
inverse	Opposite in nature or effect or relation to another quantity. A term is in <b>inverse</b> proportion to another term if it increases or decreases as the other decreases or increases.
later	At or toward an end or late period or stage of development. <i>Later</i> on it will be easier.
posthumous	(of a child) born after the death of its father. A <b>posthumous</b> collection of his articles.



<u>regress</u>	Calculate the coefficient or coefficients of regression of a variable against or on another variable. I <b>regress</b> ed Sylvia to early childhood.
<u>regression</u>	A defense mechanism in which you flee from reality by assuming a more infantile state. It is easy to blame unrest on economic <b>regression</b> .
regressive	(of a tax) taking a proportionally greater amount from those on lower incomes. Indirect taxes are as a group <b>regressive</b> .
<u>relapse</u>	Return to (a less active or a worse state. <i>He <b>relapse</b>d into silence.</i>
<u>restitution</u>	The act of restoring something to its original state. <b>Restitution</b> of the damaged mucosa.
restoration	The restoration of the Bourbon monarchy in France in 1814 following the fall of Napoleon Louis XVIII was recalled from exile by Talleyrand. <i>The altar paintings seem in need of <b>restoration</b>.</i>
retrace	Trace (something) back to its source or beginning. <i>He began to <b>retrace</b> his steps to the station car park.</i>
retreat	Make a retreat from an earlier commitment or activity. <i>The bugle sounded a <b>retreat</b></i> .
retrieval	The cognitive operation of accessing information in memory. Online information <b>retrieval</b> .
retrieve	Run after, pick up, and bring to the master. <i>Train the dog to <b>retrieve</b></i> .
<u>retroactive</u>	Affecting things past. <i>Retroactive</i> tax increase.
retrograde	Show retrograde motion. The <b>retrograde</b> form of these inscriptions.
retrogression	The process of returning to an earlier state, typically a worse one. A <b>retrogression</b> to 19th century attitudes.
<u>retrospect</u>	Look back upon (a period of time, sequence of events); remember. In <b>retrospect</b> .
retrospective	Concerned with or related to the past. <i>Retrospective</i> pay awards.
return	A returning officer s announcement of an election result. <i>Return</i> a kickback.



reversion	A property to which someone has the right of reversion. A problem applicable to most variegated plants is that of <b>reversion</b> .
<u>revert</u>	Undergo reversion, as in a mutation. If interested kindly <b>revert</b> with your updated resume.
<u>throwback</u>	An organism that has the characteristics of a more primitive type of that organism. The eyes could be an ancestral <b>throwback</b> .
