## Associations of "Bring back" (30 Words)

<b><u>anachronism</u></b>	The action of attributing something to a period to which it does not belong. <i>The town is a throwback to medieval times an <b>anachronism</b> that has survived the passing years.</i>
<b>backslide</b>	Drop to a lower level, as in one’s morals or standards. <i>There are many things that can cause slimmers to <b>backslide</b>.</i>
<b>backward</b>	(of a fielding position) behind an imaginary line passing through the stumps at the batsman’s end at right angles to the wicket. <i>An economically <b>backward</b> country.</i>
<b>backwards</b>	(of a movement) in the direction of one’s back. <i>A step <b>backwards</b> for the economy.</i>
<b>behind</b>	A kick that sends the ball over a behind line or a touch that sends it between the inner posts scoring one point. <i>England were still 382 runs <b>behind</b>.</i>
<b>come</b>	Come to pass arrive as in due course. <i>Melons <b>come</b> from a vine.</i>
<b>degeneracy</b>	The state of being degenerate in mental or moral qualities. <i>Moral <b>degeneracy</b> followed intellectual degeneration.</i>
<b>degeneration</b>	The state of being degenerate in mental or moral qualities. <i>Overgrazing has caused serious <b>degeneration</b> of grassland.</i>
<b>inverse</b>	Opposite in nature or effect or relation to another quantity. <i>A term is in <b>inverse</b> proportion to another term if it increases or decreases as the other decreases or increases.</i>
<b>later</b>	At or toward an end or late period or stage of development. <i><b>Later</b> on it will be easier.</i>
<b>posthumous</b>	(of a child) born after the death of its father. <i>A <b>posthumous</b> collection of his articles.</i>

<b><u>regress</u></b>	Calculate the coefficient or coefficients of regression of a variable against or on another variable. <i>I <b>regressed</b> Sylvia to early childhood.</i>
<b><u>regression</u></b>	A defense mechanism in which you flee from reality by assuming a more infantile state. <i>It is easy to blame unrest on economic <b>regression</b>.</i>
<b>regressive</b>	(of a tax) taking a proportionally greater amount from those on lower incomes. <i>Indirect taxes are as a group <b>regressive</b>.</i>
<b><u>relapse</u></b>	Return to (a less active or a worse state). <i>He <b>relapsed</b> into silence.</i>
<b><u>restitution</u></b>	The act of restoring something to its original state. <i><b>Restitution</b> of the damaged mucosa.</i>
<b>restoration</b>	The restoration of the Bourbon monarchy in France in 1814 following the fall of Napoleon Louis XVIII was recalled from exile by Talleyrand. <i>The altar paintings seem in need of <b>restoration</b>.</i>
<b>retrace</b>	Trace (something) back to its source or beginning. <i>He began to <b>retrace</b> his steps to the station car park.</i>
<b>retreat</b>	Make a retreat from an earlier commitment or activity. <i>The bugle sounded a <b>retreat</b>.</i>
<b>retrieval</b>	The cognitive operation of accessing information in memory. <i>Online information <b>retrieval</b>.</i>
<b>retrieve</b>	Run after, pick up, and bring to the master. <i>Train the dog to <b>retrieve</b>.</i>
<b><u>retroactive</u></b>	Affecting things past. <i><b>Retroactive</b> tax increase.</i>
<b>retrograde</b>	Show retrograde motion. <i>The <b>retrograde</b> form of these inscriptions.</i>
<b>retrogression</b>	The process of returning to an earlier state, typically a worse one. <i>A <b>retrogression</b> to 19th century attitudes.</i>
<b><u>retrospect</u></b>	Look back upon (a period of time, sequence of events); remember. <i>In <b>retrospect</b>.</i>
<b>retrospective</b>	Concerned with or related to the past. <i><b>Retrospective</b> pay awards.</i>
<b>return</b>	A returning officer's announcement of an election result. <i><b>Return</b> a kickback.</i>

**reversion** A property to which someone has the right of reversion.  
*A problem applicable to most variegated plants is that of **reversion**.*

**revert** Undergo reversion, as in a mutation.  
*If interested kindly **revert** with your updated resume.*

**throwback** An organism that has the characteristics of a more primitive type of that organism.  
*The eyes could be an ancestral **throwback**.*
