## Associations of "Bring down" (30 Words)

<a href="#">curtail</a>	Reduce in extent or quantity; impose a restriction on. <i>Civil liberties were further <b>curtailed</b>.</i>
<b>debase</b>	Corrupt or make impure by adding a foreign or inferior substance often by replacing valuable ingredients with inferior ones. <i>The King was forced to <b>debase</b> the coinage.</i>
<b>declension</b>	A downward slope or bend. <i>The <b>declension</b> of the new generation.</i>
<b>decline</b>	Bend down; droop. <i>The birth rate continued to <b>decline</b>.</i>
<b>declivity</b>	A downward slope. <i>A thickly wooded <b>declivity</b>.</i>
<b>decrease</b>	The amount by which something decreases. <i>The aisles were <b>decreased</b> in height.</i>
<b>decrement</b>	The amount by which something decreases. <i>The dose was reduced by 10 mg weekly <b>decrements</b>.</i>
<b>demoralize</b>	Lower someone's spirits; make downhearted. <i>The General Strike had <b>demoralized</b> the trade unions.</i>
<a href="#">depletion</a>	Reduction in the number or quantity of something. <i>The <b>depletion</b> of the ozone layer.</i>
<a href="#">depress</a>	Lower someone's spirits; make downhearted. <i>The rising inflation <b>depressed</b> the economy.</i>
<b>descend</b>	Make a sudden attack on. <i>The militia <b>descended</b> on Rye.</i>
<b>descending</b>	Moving down a scale of quality. <i>A passage of <b>descending</b> chords.</i>
<a href="#">descent</a>	Properties attributable to your ancestry. <i>A steep badly eroded <b>descent</b>.</i>

<b>diminish</b>	Decrease in size, extent, or range. <i>The trial has aged and <b>diminished</b> him.</i>
<b>downgrade</b>	A downward gradient on a railway or road. <i>Some jobs had gradually been <b>downgraded</b> from skilled to semi skilled.</i>
<b><u>downturn</u></b>	A worsening of business or economic activity. <i>The market took a <b>downturn</b>.</i>
<b>downward</b>	Towards a lower place, point, or level. <i>The <b>downward</b> pull of gravity.</i>
<b>drop</b>	An act of dropping supplies or troops by parachute. <i>The light <b>dropped</b> from the ceiling.</i>
<b>fall</b>	A controlled act of falling especially as a stunt or in martial arts. <i><b>Fall</b> into a strange way of thinking.</i>
<b><u>falling</u></b>	Moving from a higher to a lower level, typically rapidly and without control. <i><b>Falling</b> standards.</i>
<b>lessen</b>	Wear off or die down. <i>The warmth of the afternoon <b>lessened</b>.</i>
<b><u>low</u></b>	Of a vowel pronounced with the tongue held low in the mouth open. <i>His popularity ratings are at an all time <b>low</b>.</i>
<b><u>lower</u></b>	Set lower. <i>Land of a <b>lower</b> quality.</i>
<b>reduce</b>	Reduce in size reduce physically. <i>She has been <b>reduced</b> to near poverty.</i>
<b>reduction</b>	The action of remedying a dislocation or fracture by returning the affected part of the body to its normal position. <i>We must see if the fracture requires <b>reduction</b>.</i>
<b><u>rundown</u></b>	A concluding summary (as in presenting a case before a law court). <i>A <b>rundown</b> in the business would be a devastating blow to the local economy.</i>
<b>sink</b>	Fall or sink heavily. <i>They agreed to <b>sink</b> their differences.</i>
<b>submergence</b>	The process or state of being submerged in or covered with water. <i>Total <b>submergence</b> of plants results in heavy crop losses.</i>
<b><u>substrate</u></b>	A material which provides the surface on which something is deposited or inscribed, for example the silicon wafer used to manufacture integrated circuits. <i>Optical disk <b>substrates</b>.</i>
