Associations of "Bring forth" (30 Words)

ambush	Hunt quarry by stalking and ambushing. <i>Tory representatives were ambushed by camera crews.</i>
apart	To or on one side; at a distance from the main body. <i>He leapt out of the car just before it was blown apart.</i>
backlash	A strong negative reaction by a large number of people, especially to a social or political development. <i>A public backlash against racism.</i>
bounce	Hit something so that it bounces. <i>The car bounced down the narrow track.</i>
broach	A decorative pin worn by women. <i>He broached the subject he had been avoiding all evening.</i>
bullock	A male domestic bovine animal that has been castrated and is raised for beef. <i>People have dropped dead bullocking their guts out.</i>
bumpy	(of a surface) uneven, with many patches raised above the rest. <i>The bumpy flight brought on a bout of airsickness.</i>
cart	Transport something in a cart. <i>Their pushcart was piled high with groceries.</i>
distant	Remote or far apart in resemblance or relationship. <i>I remember that distant afternoon.</i>
far	Being the animal or vehicle on the right or being on the right side of an animal or vehicle. <i>The far right.</i>
faraway	Very far away in space or time. <i>She had a faraway look in her eyes.</i>
fetch	The action of fetching. <i>Kind offers fetched tears from me.</i>

further	In addition or furthermore. <i>This theme will be developed further in Chapter 6.</i>
haul	The act of drawing or hauling something. <i>He made a living hauling coal.</i>
hop	A hopping movement. <i>The society's regular fortnightly hop.</i>
inaccessible	Capable of being reached only with great difficulty or not at all. <i>The city centre is inaccessible to traffic in most places.</i>
jump	Jump from an airplane and descend with a parachute. <i>They jumped back into the car and drove off.</i>
leap	Cause to jump or leap. <i>The child leapt across the puddle.</i>
outside	On the outside. <i>Disdaining outside pressure groups.</i>
ox	Used in names of wild animals related to or resembling a domesticated ox e.g musk ox. <i>An ox cart.</i>
pounce	The act of pouncing. <i>The gang pounced on him and knocked him to the ground.</i>
rebound	The act of securing possession of the rebounding basketball after a missed shot. <i>He proved that he can score and rebound as well as any of his peers.</i>
recoil	The action of recoiling. <i>If man upsets his planetary ecosystem it will automatically recoil upon him.</i>
remote	A remote control device. <i>Remote stars.</i>
resurface	Arise or become evident again. <i>I helped my mother to resurface the kitchen floor.</i>
separately	Apart from others. <i>I shall consider that figure separately from the prime costs.</i>
skip	A light bouncing step a skipping movement. <i>She began to skip down the path.</i>
spring	Spring back spring away from an impact. <i>The president sought to spring the hostages.</i>
tumbrel	A farm dumpcart for carrying dung; carts of this type were used to carry prisoners to the guillotine during the French Revolution.
