abidance	The act of dwelling in a place.
aboveground	On or above the surface of the ground. <i>Aboveground nuclear testing.</i>

<u>absenteeism</u>	Habitual absence from work. <i>High levels of absenteeism caused by low job motivation.</i>
accordingly	Because of the reason given. <i>We have to discover what his plans are and act accordingly.</i>
addressee	One to whom something is addressed. <i>The need to state clearly the addressees of reports.</i>
<u>away</u>	Out of the way especially away from one's thoughts. <i>Sent the children away to boarding school.</i>
<u>barring</u>	The act of excluding someone by a negative vote or veto.
<u>besides</u>	In addition. <i>I'm capable of doing the work and a lot more besides.</i>
bullock	Work long and hard. <i>People have dropped dead bullocking their guts out.</i>
by	So as to pass a given point. <i>He let only a moment go by.</i>
cart	Transport something in a cart. <i>They were carted off to the nearest police station.</i>
drag	The act of dragging pulling with force. <i>He took a long drag on his cigarette.</i>
except	Take exception to. <i>Five classes of advertisement are excepted from control.</i>

exclude	Prevent from entering; keep out. <i>The bad results were excluded from the report.</i>
<u>exhale</u>	Give out (breath or an odor). <i>The jungle exhaled mists of early morning.</i>
get	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>What do you get when you add up these numbers.</i>
<u>haul</u>	The act of drawing or hauling something. <i>The engine hauls the overnight sleeper from London Euston.</i>
home	Made done or intended for use in the home. <i>The growth in home ownership.</i>
instead	As an alternative or substitute. <i>Felix became a herpetologist instead.</i>
leave	Leave behind unintentionally. <i>She was granted leave to speak.</i>
mail	A single delivery or collection of mail. <i>I ll mail you the check tomorrow.</i>
mailing	The transmission of a letter. <i>The postmark indicates the time of mailing.</i>
<u>omit</u>	Fail or neglect to do. <i>He was omitted from the second Test.</i>
recipient	Receiving or capable of receiving something. <i>A recipient country.</i>
<u>redefine</u>	Give a new or different definition of (a word). <i>The role of the Emperor was redefined.</i>
<u>residence</u>	A large and imposing house. <i>She took up residence in Paris.</i>
respire	(of a plant) carry out respiration, especially at night when photosynthesis has ceased. <i>A country where fresh air seems impossible to respire.</i>
sender	A person who sends or transmits a message, letter, email, etc. <i>Return to sender.</i>
tumbrel	A farm dumpcart for carrying dung; carts of this type were used to carry prisoners to the guillotine during the French Revolution.
