## Associations of "Brings out" (30 Words)

<b>abidance</b>	The act of dwelling in a place.
<b>aboveground</b>	On or above the surface of the ground. <i><b>Aboveground</b> nuclear testing.</i>
<b>absentee</b>	One that is absent or not in residence. <i>An <b>absentee</b> from the match.</i>
<b><u>absenteeism</u></b>	Habitual absence from work. <i>High levels of <b>absenteeism</b> caused by low job motivation.</i>
<b>accordingly</b>	Because of the reason given. <i>We have to discover what his plans are and act <b>accordingly</b>.</i>
<b>addressee</b>	One to whom something is addressed. <i>The need to state clearly the <b>addressees</b> of reports.</i>
<b><u>away</u></b>	Out of the way especially away from one's thoughts. <i>Sent the children <b>away</b> to boarding school.</i>
<b><u>barring</u></b>	The act of excluding someone by a negative vote or veto.
<b><u>besides</u></b>	In addition. <i>I'm capable of doing the work and a lot more <b>besides</b>.</i>
<b>bullock</b>	Work long and hard. <i>People have dropped dead <b>bullocking</b> their guts out.</i>
<b>by</b>	So as to pass a given point. <i>He let only a moment go <b>by</b>.</i>
<b>cart</b>	Transport something in a cart. <i>They were <b>carted</b> off to the nearest police station.</i>
<b>drag</b>	The act of dragging pulling with force. <i>He took a long <b>drag</b> on his cigarette.</i>
<b>except</b>	Take exception to. <i>Five classes of advertisement are <b>excepted</b> from control.</i>

<b>exclude</b>	Prevent from entering; keep out. <i>The bad results were <b>excluded</b> from the report.</i>
<b><u>exhale</u></b>	Give out (breath or an odor). <i>The jungle <b>exhaled</b> mists of early morning.</i>
<b>get</b>	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>What do you <b>get</b> when you add up these numbers.</i>
<b><u>haul</u></b>	The act of drawing or hauling something. <i>The engine <b>hauls</b> the overnight sleeper from London Euston.</i>
<b>home</b>	Made done or intended for use in the home. <i>The growth in <b>home</b> ownership.</i>
<b>instead</b>	As an alternative or substitute. <i>Felix became a herpetologist <b>instead</b>.</i>
<b>leave</b>	Leave behind unintentionally. <i>She was granted <b>leave</b> to speak.</i>
<b>mail</b>	A single delivery or collection of mail. <i>I ll <b>mail</b> you the check tomorrow.</i>
<b>mailing</b>	The transmission of a letter. <i>The postmark indicates the time of <b>mailing</b>.</i>
<b><u>omit</u></b>	Fail or neglect to do. <i>He was <b>omitted</b> from the second Test.</i>
<b>recipient</b>	Receiving or capable of receiving something. <i>A <b>recipient</b> country.</i>
<b><u>redefine</u></b>	Give a new or different definition of (a word). <i>The role of the Emperor was <b>redefined</b>.</i>
<b><u>residence</u></b>	A large and imposing house. <i>She took up <b>residence</b> in Paris.</i>
<b>respire</b>	(of a plant) carry out respiration, especially at night when photosynthesis has ceased. <i>A country where fresh air seems impossible to <b>respire</b>.</i>
<b>sender</b>	A person who sends or transmits a message, letter, email, etc. <i>Return to <b>sender</b>.</i>
<b>tumbrel</b>	A farm dumpcart for carrying dung; carts of this type were used to carry prisoners to the guillotine during the French Revolution.
