| aggrandize | Add details to. <i>He hoped to aggrandize himself by dying a hero's death.</i> |
| amplify | Make multiple copies of (a gene or DNA sequence). <i>The manufacturers have developed a system of amplifying the radio signal.</i> |
| bloat | Make bloated or swollen. <i>The dead man's stomach was bloated.</i> |
| broad | Broad in scope or content T G Winner. <i>The valley is three miles long and half a mile broad.</i> |
| diffuse | Spread or diffuse through. <i>Gas is diffused into the bladder.</i> |
| dilate | Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing. <i>Her eyes dilated with horror.</i> |
| distend | Cause to expand as it by internal pressure. <i>Air is introduced into the stomach to distend it.</i> |
| diversify | Vary in order to spread risk or to expand. <i>New plants will diversify the habitat.</i> |
| elongate | Long in relation to width elongated. <i>An elongate tail tapering to a point.</i> |
| enlarge | Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing. <i>She enlarged the flower beds.</i> |
| escalation | An increase to counteract a perceived discrepancy. <i>Higher wages caused an escalation of prices.</i> |
| expand | Expand the influence of. <i>Their business expanded into other hotels.</i> |

| expansion | A discussion that provides additional information. <i>The rapid expansion of suburban London.</i> |
| exponentially | By means of or as expressed by a mathematical exponent. <i>Values distributed exponentially according to a given time constant.</i> |
| extend | Thrust or extend out. <i>The law was extended to all citizens.</i> |
| growing | The process of an individual organism growing organically a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>The growing concern over ozone levels.</i> |
| lengthen | Make longer. <i>In the spring when the days are lengthening.</i> |
| magnification | A magnified reproduction of something. <i>At this magnification the pixels making up the image become visible.</i> |
| magnify | Increase in size, volume or significance. <i>Praise the Lord and magnify Him.</i> |
| pervasiveness | The quality of spreading widely or being present throughout an area or a group of people. <i>The pervasiveness of violence on television.</i> |
| proliferate | Grow rapidly. <i>Cultured cells often proliferate indefinitely.</i> |
| prolongation | Extension of the duration of something. <i>An agreement on further prolongation of the boundary proved difficult.</i> |
| propagate | Cause to propagate as by grafting or layering. <i>The French propagated the idea that the English were drunkards.</i> |
| protract | Prolong. <i>He had certainly taken his time even protracting the process.</i> |
| spread | The fact or process of spreading over an area. <i>The spread of the urban population into rural areas.</i> |
| stretch | A stretch limo. <i>There were stretches of boredom.</i> |
| stretching | Act of expanding by lengthening or widening. |
| swell | Excellently; very well. <i>She felt herself swell with pride.</i> |
| unfold | Extend or stretch out to a greater or the full length. <i>He unfolded the map and laid it out on the table.</i> |
