Associations of "Broken down" (30 Words)

blighted	Affected by blight; anything that mars or prevents growth or prosperity. <i>Blighted urban districts.</i>
collapse	Cause a lung or blood vessel to collapse. <i>The collapse of a railway bridge.</i>
curtail	Place restrictions on. <i>Civil liberties were further curtailed.</i>
debase	Corrupt debase or make impure by adding a foreign or inferior substance often by replacing valuable ingredients with inferior ones. <i>War debases people.</i>
declension	A class of nouns or pronouns or adjectives in Indo-European languages having the same (or very similar) inflectional forms. <i>The first declension in Latin.</i>
declivity	A downward slope or bend. <i>A thickly wooded declivity.</i>
decrease	The amount by which something decreases. <i>The population of the area has decreased radically.</i>
demoralize	Corrupt the morals of (someone). <i>The General Strike had demoralized the trade unions.</i>
descend	(of night or darkness) begin to occur. <i>Groups of visiting supporters descended on a local pub.</i>
descending	Moving or sloping downwards. <i>The categories are listed in descending order of usefulness.</i>
descent	An unexpected visit. <i>The plane had gone into a steep descent.</i>
destroyed	Destroyed physically or morally. <i>Alzheimer s is responsible for her destroyed mind.</i>

downturn	A worsening of business or economic activity. <i>A downturn in the housing market.</i>
downward	Towards a lower place, point, or level. <i>The downward pull of gravity.</i>
drop	An instance of falling or dropping. <i>I got to the depot and made the drop.</i>
fall	An act of falling or collapsing. <i>A fall from virtue.</i>
falling	Coming down freely under the influence of gravity. <i>Falling temperatures.</i>
flop	With a flopping sound. <i>He landed on the bed with a great flop.</i>
irremediable	Impossible to remedy or correct or redress. <i>Irremediable marital breakdowns.</i>
irreparable	Impossible to repair, rectify, or amend. <i>They were doing irreparable damage to my heart and lungs.</i>
irreparably	In an irreparable manner or to an irreparable degree. <i>His eye had been damaged irreparably.</i>
low	Of a vowel pronounced with the tongue held low in the mouth open. <i>The weatherman talked about highs and lows.</i>
lower	Move something or somebody to a lower position. <i>Lower expectations.</i>
reduction	The amount by which something is made smaller, less, or lower in price. <i>We must see if the fracture requires reduction.</i>
rundown	(of a company or industry) in a poor economic state. <i>He gave his teammates a rundown on the opposition.</i>
shattered	Exhausted. <i>He was said to be absolutely shattered after losing his job.</i>
sink	Cause a ship to sink. <i>The doctor concluded that the lad was sinking fast.</i>
submergence	Sinking until covered completely with water. <i>Politicians may be blamed for submergence of principle.</i>
substrate	Any stratum or layer lying underneath another. <i>The Celtic languages of Britain are a substrate for English.</i>
under	Under water. <i>An under secretary.</i>
