Definitions of "Broom" as a noun

- *A flowering shrub with long, thin green stems and small or few leaves, cultivated for its profusion of flowers.*
- *A long-handled brush of bristles or twigs, used for sweeping.*
- *Common Old World heath represented by many varieties; low evergreen grown widely in the northern hemisphere.*
- *An implement for sweeping the ice in the game of curling.*
- *A cleaning implement for sweeping; bundle of straws or twigs attached to a long handle.*
- *Any of various shrubs of the genera Cytisus or Genista or Spartium having long slender branches and racemes of yellow flowers.*

| mop | To wash or wipe with or as if with a mop. <i>Mop and mow.</i> |
| mote | A tiny piece of anything. <i>The tiniest mote of dust.</i> |
| mow | Cut with a blade or mower. <i>Mop and mow.</i> |
| particle | Any of numerous subatomic constituents of the physical world that interact with each other including electrons neutrinos photons and alpha particles. <i>Tiny particles of dust.</i> |
| scrub | An act of scrubbing something or someone. <i>Don t use facial scrubs if your skin is sensitive.</i> |
| soot | Cover or clog something with soot. <i>You have previously sooted the underside of their plate by holding it over a candle.</i> |
| stained | (of a material or object) coloured by application of a penetrative dye or chemical. <i>Her ink stained fingers.</i> |
| sweep | Move with sweeping effortless gliding motions. <i>A sweep of his arm.</i> |
| sweeping | Dirt or refuse collected by sweeping. <i>A smooth sweeping motion.</i> |

toothbrush Small brush; has long handle; used to clean teeth.

vacuum Clean with a vacuum cleaner.
*Without their support he ll be ruling in a **vacuum**.*

wag Move (an upwards-pointing finger) from side to side to signify disapproval.
*His tail began to **wag**.*

wash An act of washing something or an instance of being washed.
*An oil slick **washed** up on the beaches.*

witch A woman who is bewitchingly attractive.
*He can marry the old **witch** for all I care.*
