## **Brothers as a Noun**

#### Definitions of "Brothers" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "brothers" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- (Roman Catholic Church) a title given to a monk and used as form of address.
- A male with the same parents as someone else.
- Used as a term of address for those male persons engaged in the same movement.
- A male person who is a fellow member (of a fraternity or religion or other group.
- A title given to a monk and used as form of address.
- A close friend who accompanies his buddies in their activities.





## Synonyms of "Brothers" as a noun (7 Words)

**blood brother** The fluid (red in vertebrates) that is pumped through the body by the heart and contains plasma, blood cells, and platelets.

<u>buddy</u>	A working companion with whom close cooperation is required. I m working on it <b>buddy</b> .
chum	A close friend who accompanies his buddies in their activities. An old school <b>chum</b> .
<u>comrade</u>	A fellow member of the Communist Party. <i>Comrades in arms.</i>
<u>crony</u>	A close friend or companion. <i>He went gambling with his cronies.</i>
<u>pal</u>	Used as a form of address, especially to indicate anger or aggression. <i>We ve been <b>pal</b>s for a long time.</i>



#### sidekick

A person's assistant or close associate, especially one who has less authority than that person. *Sherlock Holmes bumbling sidekick Watson.* 



### Usage Examples of "Brothers" as a noun

- *My brother still lives with our parents.*
- None of his brothers would betray him.





# Associations of "Brothers" (30 Words)

<u>acquaintance</u>	Acquaintances considered collectively. The pupils had little <b>acquaintance</b> with the language.
<u>aunt</u>	An unrelated adult female friend, especially of a child. She was brought up by her <b>aunt</b> and uncle.
<u>avuncular</u>	Relating to the relationship between men and the children of their siblings. <i>He was avuncular reassuring and trustworthy.</i>
niiddy	A working companion with whom close cooperation is required. I decided to <b>buddy</b> up to them.
<u>comrade</u>	Used as a term of address for those male persons engaged in the same movement. <i>Comrades in arms.</i>
cousin	A person in one's wider extended family, to whom one is not closely related. <i>Our American cousins</i> .



<u>crony</u>	A close friend who accompanies his buddies in their activities. <i>He went gambling with his cronies.</i>
<u>daughter</u>	A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source. A <b>daughter</b> of the dry savannas of Africa.
<u>elder</u>	A member of a senate or governing body. She was two years his <b>elder</b> .
<u>familial</u>	Relating to or occurring in a family or its members. <i>Certain diseases are <b>familial</b>.</i>
family	The children of a person or couple being discussed. She has the sole responsibility for a large <b>family</b> .
fraternal	(of twins) derived from two separate fertilized ova. His lack of <b>fraternal</b> feeling shocked me.
friend	Add someone to a list of friends or contacts on a social networking website. <i>They are <b>friend</b>s of the library.</i>
grandma	The mother of your father or mother. <i>Grandma</i> Wendy.
grandparent	A parent of your father or mother. It must be a great blessing to have Chloe s <b>grandparent</b> s living nearby.
kinsfolk	People descended from a common ancestor.
mate	South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly called mate. <i>He lost the mate to his shoe.</i>
maternal	Characteristic of a mother- Dorothy Sayers. Warm <b>maternal</b> affection for her guest.
<u>mother</u>	A woman who has given birth to a child also used as a term of address to your mother. She <b>mother</b> ed her husband insisting he should take cod liver oil in the winter.
nephew	A son of one's brother or sister, or of one's brother-in-law or sister-in-law.
niece	A daughter of your brother or sister.
<u>pal</u>	Become friends; act friendly towards. She <b>pal</b> led up with some English chaps.
<u>parent</u>	Be or act as a parent to a child. Stems will root down creating a new crown near the <b>parent</b> .
paternal	Relating to or characteristic of or befitting a parent. A <b>paternal</b> aunt.
<u>sibling</u>	A person's brother or sister.



<u>sister</u>	A woman or girl in relation to other daughters and sons of her parents. Securicor and its <b>sister</b> company Securicor Services.
sisterhood	A religious society of women who live together as sisters (especially an order of nuns. <i>Canadian feminists acknowledge their sisterhood with women around the globe.</i>
stepmother	A woman who is the wife or partner of one's father after the divorce or separation of one's parents or the death of one's mother.
<u>twin</u>	Of a crystal twinned. The hotel has 54 rooms of which 4 are <b>twin</b> s.
uncle	A pawnbroker. <i>He visited his <b>uncle</b>.</i>
