Brothers as a Noun

Definitions of "Brothers" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “brothers” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *(Roman Catholic Church) a title given to a monk and used as form of address.*
- *A male with the same parents as someone else.*
- *Used as a term of address for those male persons engaged in the same movement.*
- *A male person who is a fellow member (of a fraternity or religion or other group).*
- *A title given to a monk and used as form of address.*
- *A close friend who accompanies his buddies in their activities.*



Synonyms of "Brothers" as a noun (7 Words)

- blood brother** The fluid (red in vertebrates) that is pumped through the body by the heart and contains plasma, blood cells, and platelets.
- buddy** A working companion with whom close cooperation is required.
*I m working on it **buddy**.*
- chum** A close friend who accompanies his buddies in their activities.
*An old school **chum**.*
- comrade** A fellow member of the Communist Party.
***Comrades** in arms.*
- crony** A close friend or companion.
He went gambling with his cronies.
- pal** Used as a form of address, especially to indicate anger or aggression.
*We ve been **pals** for a long time.*

sidekick

A person's assistant or close associate, especially one who has less authority than that person.

*Sherlock Holmes bumbling **sidekick** Watson.*



Usage Examples of "Brothers" as a noun

- *My brother still lives with our parents.*
- *None of his brothers would betray him.*



Associations of "Brothers" (30 Words)

- acquaintance** Acquaintances considered collectively.
*The pupils had little **acquaintance** with the language.*
- aunt** An unrelated adult female friend, especially of a child.
*She was brought up by her **aunt** and uncle.*
- avuncular** Relating to the relationship between men and the children of their siblings.
*He was **avuncular** reassuring and trustworthy.*
- buddy** A working companion with whom close cooperation is required.
*I decided to **buddy** up to them.*
- comrade** Used as a term of address for those male persons engaged in the same movement.
***Comrades** in arms.*
- cousin** A person in one's wider extended family, to whom one is not closely related.
*Our American **cousins**.*

<u>crony</u>	A close friend who accompanies his buddies in their activities. <i>He went gambling with his cronies.</i>
<u>daughter</u>	A thing personified as a daughter in relation to its origin or source. <i>A daughter of the dry savannas of Africa.</i>
<u>elder</u>	A member of a senate or governing body. <i>She was two years his elder.</i>
<u>familial</u>	Relating to or occurring in a family or its members. <i>Certain diseases are familial.</i>
family	The children of a person or couple being discussed. <i>She has the sole responsibility for a large family.</i>
fraternal	(of twins) derived from two separate fertilized ova. <i>His lack of fraternal feeling shocked me.</i>
friend	Add someone to a list of friends or contacts on a social networking website. <i>They are friends of the library.</i>
grandma	The mother of your father or mother. <i>Grandma Wendy.</i>
grandparent	A parent of your father or mother. <i>It must be a great blessing to have Chloe's grandparents living nearby.</i>
kinsfolk	People descended from a common ancestor.
mate	South American tea like drink made from leaves of a South American holly called mate. <i>He lost the mate to his shoe.</i>
maternal	Characteristic of a mother- Dorothy Sayers. <i>Warm maternal affection for her guest.</i>
<u>mother</u>	A woman who has given birth to a child also used as a term of address to your mother. <i>She mothered her husband insisting he should take cod liver oil in the winter.</i>
nephew	A son of one's brother or sister, or of one's brother-in-law or sister-in-law.
niece	A daughter of your brother or sister.
<u>pal</u>	Become friends; act friendly towards. <i>She palled up with some English chaps.</i>
<u>parent</u>	Be or act as a parent to a child. <i>Stems will root down creating a new crown near the parent.</i>
paternal	Relating to or characteristic of or befitting a parent. <i>A paternal aunt.</i>
<u>sibling</u>	A person's brother or sister.

- sister** A woman or girl in relation to other daughters and sons of her parents.
*Securicor and its **sister** company Securicor Services.*
- sisterhood** A religious society of women who live together as sisters (especially an order of nuns).
*Canadian feminists acknowledge their **sisterhood** with women around the globe.*
- stepmother** A woman who is the wife or partner of one's father after the divorce or separation of one's parents or the death of one's mother.
- twin** Of a crystal twinned.
*The hotel has 54 rooms of which 4 are **twins**.*
- uncle** A pawnbroker.
*He visited his **uncle**.*
