annuitant	The recipient of an annuity.
attract	Be attractive to. <i>Her good looks attract the stares of many men.</i>
<u>basket</u>	The quantity contained in a basket. <i>A basket of ten currencies.</i>
broach	Open and start using the contents of (a bottle or other container). <i>The salmon broach then fall to slap the water.</i>
bullock	Young bull. <i>People have dropped dead bullocking their guts out.</i>
cart	Convey or put in a cart or similar vehicle. <i>Weary of carting instruments around they converted an industrial space into a studio.</i>
come	Come from be connected by a relationship of blood for example. <i>Come down here.</i>
<u>convey</u>	Take something or somebody with oneself somewhere. <i>No application for registration is required when the property is conveyed following a court order.</i>
drag	The act of dragging pulling with force. <i>I couldn't drag my eyes away.</i>
<u>elicit</u>	Call forth (emotions, feelings, and responses). <i>The work elicited enormous public interest.</i>
<u>engage</u>	Engage or hire for work. <i>She had offered to engage a room in the house of the woman.</i>
<u>entail</u>	A property bequeathed under an entail. <i>Her father's estate was entailed on a cousin.</i>
extort	Obtain through intimidation. <i>He attempted to extort money from the company.</i>

extract	Extract by the process of distillation. <i>The table is extracted from the report.</i>
fetch	The action of fetching. <i>The old print fetched a high price at the auction.</i>
get	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>Did you get it.</i>
gravitational	Denoting a forceful attraction or movement towards something. <i>For many international companies Russia's gravitational pull is simply too strong to resist.</i>
handled	Having a usually specified type of handle. <i>A two handled cup.</i>
haul	The act of drawing or hauling something. <i>The thirty mile haul to Boston.</i>
have	Have sex with archaic use. <i>How many cars does she have.</i>
impose	Impose and collect. <i>The director was unable to impose himself on the production.</i>
lend	Bestow a quality on. <i>Stewart asked me to lend him my car.</i>
ox	Used in names of wild animals related to or resembling a domesticated ox e.g musk ox. <i>Laden wagons pulled by lowing oxen travel down to the coast.</i>
pull	Cause to move by pulling. <i>Pull a horse.</i>
take	Of a plant or seed take root or begin to grow germinate. <i>We take the Times every day.</i>
tow	A rope or line used to tow a vehicle or boat. <i>A pickup van towing a trailer.</i>
trail	A trailer for a film or broadcast. <i>A recent television trail for The Bill.</i>
truck	Convey by truck. <i>Private contractors were trucking for Denali.</i>
tumbrel	A farm dumpcart for carrying dung; carts of this type were used to carry prisoners to the guillotine during the French Revolution.
wreak	Cause to happen or to occur as a consequence. <i>They would soon have a chance to wreak their revenge on the enemy.</i>
