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## Associations of "Brought" (30 Words)

<b>annuitant</b>	The recipient of an annuity.
<b>attract</b>	Be attractive to. <i>Her good looks <b>attract</b> the stares of many men.</i>
<b><a href="#">basket</a></b>	The quantity contained in a basket. <i>A <b>basket</b> of ten currencies.</i>
<b>broach</b>	Open and start using the contents of (a bottle or other container). <i>The salmon <b>broach</b> then fall to slap the water.</i>
<b>bullock</b>	Young bull. <i>People have dropped dead <b>bullocking</b> their guts out.</i>
<b>cart</b>	Convey or put in a cart or similar vehicle. <i>Weary of <b>carting</b> instruments around they converted an industrial space into a studio.</i>
<b>come</b>	Come from be connected by a relationship of blood for example. <i><b>Come</b> down here.</i>
<b><a href="#">convey</a></b>	Take something or somebody with oneself somewhere. <i>No application for registration is required when the property is <b>conveyed</b> following a court order.</i>
<b>drag</b>	The act of dragging pulling with force. <i>I couldn't <b>drag</b> my eyes away.</i>
<b><a href="#">elicit</a></b>	Call forth (emotions, feelings, and responses). <i>The work <b>elicited</b> enormous public interest.</i>
<b><a href="#">engage</a></b>	Engage or hire for work. <i>She had offered to <b>engage</b> a room in the house of the woman.</i>
<b><a href="#">entail</a></b>	A property bequeathed under an entail. <i>Her father's estate was <b>entailed</b> on a cousin.</i>
<b>extort</b>	Obtain through intimidation. <i>He attempted to <b>extort</b> money from the company.</i>

<b>extract</b>	Extract by the process of distillation. <i>The table is <b>extracted</b> from the report.</i>
<b>fetch</b>	The action of fetching. <i>The old print <b>fetches</b> a high price at the auction.</i>
<b>get</b>	Take vengeance on or get even. <i>Did you <b>get</b> it.</i>
<b>gravitational</b>	Denoting a forceful attraction or movement towards something. <i>For many international companies Russia's <b>gravitational</b> pull is simply too strong to resist.</i>
<b>handled</b>	Having a usually specified type of handle. <i>A two <b>handled</b> cup.</i>
<b>haul</b>	The act of drawing or hauling something. <i>The thirty mile <b>haul</b> to Boston.</i>
<b>have</b>	Have sex with archaic use. <i>How many cars does she <b>have</b>.</i>
<b>impose</b>	Impose and collect. <i>The director was unable to <b>impose</b> himself on the production.</i>
<b>lend</b>	Bestow a quality on. <i>Stewart asked me to <b>lend</b> him my car.</i>
<b>ox</b>	Used in names of wild animals related to or resembling a domesticated ox e.g musk ox. <i>Laden wagons pulled by lowing <b>oxen</b> travel down to the coast.</i>
<b>pull</b>	Cause to move by pulling. <i><b>Pull</b> a horse.</i>
<b>take</b>	Of a plant or seed take root or begin to grow germinate. <i>We <b>take</b> the Times every day.</i>
<b>tow</b>	A rope or line used to tow a vehicle or boat. <i>A pickup van <b>towing</b> a trailer.</i>
<b>trail</b>	A trailer for a film or broadcast. <i>A recent television <b>trail</b> for The Bill.</i>
<b>truck</b>	Convey by truck. <i>Private contractors were <b>trucking</b> for Denali.</i>
<b>tumbrel</b>	A farm dumpcart for carrying dung; carts of this type were used to carry prisoners to the guillotine during the French Revolution.
<b>wreak</b>	Cause to happen or to occur as a consequence. <i>They would soon have a chance to <b>wreak</b> their revenge on the enemy.</i>
