- *Fry in a pan until it changes color.*
- *Make brown in color.*
- *Make or become brown, typically by cooking.*



Synonyms of "Brown" as a verb (6 Words)

- crisp** Of food develop a crisp surface in an oven or under a grill.
*There is a cooling breeze which **crisps** the broad clear river.*
- crisp up** Make wrinkles or creases on a smooth surface; make a pressed, folded or wrinkled line in.
- embrown** Cause to darken.
- seal** Hunt seals.
*The pine boarding should be **sealed** with polyurethane.*
- sear** Fix (an image or memory) permanently in someone's mind or memory.
***Sear** the chicken livers in a pan for a few minutes on each side.*
- singe** Burn superficially or lightly.
*My eyebrows **singed** when I bent over the flames.*

- *The draught browned the leaves on the trees in the yard.*
- *A skillet in which food has been browned.*
- *Grill the pizza until the cheese has browned.*
- *Brown the meat in the pan.*



Brown as an Adjective

Definitions of "Brown" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "brown" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Of a color similar to that of wood or earth.*
- *Deeply suntanned.*
- *(of bread) light brown in colour and typically made with unbleached or unrefined wholemeal flour.*
- *(of a person) dark-skinned or suntanned.*
- *(of skin) deeply suntanned.*
- *Of a colour produced by mixing red, yellow, and blue, as of dark wood or rich soil.*
- *Relating or belonging to a human group characterized as having relatively dark-coloured skin (chiefly used of peoples of Latin American, South Asian, or Middle*

Eastern ancestry.

bronze	Of the color of bronze.
bronzed	Having a tan color from exposure to the sun. <i>A young bronzed Apollo.</i>
browned	Deeply suntanned.
brownish	Having a brown tinge; slightly brown. <i>A brownish coloured cat.</i>
chocolate-brown	Of a color similar to that of wood or earth.
chocolate-coloured	Having the color of dark chocolate.
dark-brown	Of a color similar to that of wood or earth.
hazel	Of a light brown or yellowish brown color.
sunburned	Having reddened or inflamed skin as result of overexposure to the sun. <i>Rose water s soothing properties make it an excellent remedy for sunburned skin.</i>

suntanned	Having a tan color from exposure to the sun. <i>We were directed towards the suntanned boatman.</i>
tanned	(of skin) having a tan color from exposure to the sun. <i>A pair of oversized aviator sunglasses hid much of her tanned face.</i>
unbleached	Not artificially colored or bleached. <i>Unbleached blonde hair.</i>
weather-beaten	Worn by exposure to the weather.
wholemeal	Denoting flour or bread made from whole grains of wheat, including the husk or outer layer.

gray	Horse of a light gray or whitish color. <i>Gray flannel suit.</i>
green	Turn or become green. <i>That s a lot of green.</i>
grey	Grey hair. <i>A grey Cape Town suburb.</i>
hue	Take on color or become colored. <i>In highlights it hued to a dull silver grey.</i>
magenta	A primary subtractive color for light a dark purple red color the dye for magenta was discovered in 1859 the year of the battle of Magenta. <i>Bright pink double flowers each lined in dark magenta.</i>
marbled	(of meat) having the lean part streaked with thin layers of fat. <i>Attractively marbled cloth or paper.</i>
maroon	Of a brownish-red colour. <i>The hat is available in either white or maroon.</i>
mustard	Used in names of related plants only some of which are used to produce mustard for the table e g hedge mustard. <i>Mustard sauce.</i>

orange	Used in names of plants with similar fruit or flowers to the orange tree e.g. mock orange. <i>There was an orange glow in the sky.</i>
painted	Coated with paint. <i>In public he wore a painted smile.</i>
pigmentation	Abnormal colouring of a person's skin, typically resulting from disease.
red	A red wine. <i>The force went on red alert.</i>
scarlet	Scarlet clothes or material. <i>Silk awnings of brilliant scarlet.</i>
strawberry	The low growing plant which produces the strawberry having white flowers lobed leaves and runners and found throughout north temperate regions. <i>She thought she would wear the strawberry crushed velvet.</i>
tint	Dye someone's hair with a tint. <i>Her skin was tinted with delicate colour.</i>
wavy	Having waves. <i>She had long wavy hair.</i>
white	White colour or pigment. <i>She separated the whites from the yolks of several eggs.</i>
yellow	Yellow clothes or material. <i>Everyone dresses in yellow.</i>
