- *Vegetation (such as young shoots, twigs, and leaves) that is suitable for animals to eat.*
- *Vegetation, such as twigs and young shoots, eaten by animals.*
- *Reading superficially or at random.*
- *The act of feeding by continual nibbling.*
- *A book, magazine, or website to be casually looked through.*
- *An act of casual looking or reading.*



Synonyms of "Browse" as a noun (8 Words)

browsing	Reading superficially or at random.
flick through	A form of entertainment that enacts a story by sound and a sequence of images giving the illusion of continuous movement.
glance	A flash or gleam of light. <i>Fish sporting with quick glance Show to the Sun their wav d coats.</i>
<u>leaf</u>	A thing that resembles a leaf in being flat and thin. <i>Leaf tea.</i>
look	An expression of a feeling or thought by looking. <i>The bedraggled look of the village.</i>
read	Something that is read. <i>Their read on the national situation may be correct.</i>
<u>scan</u>	An image obtained by scanning or with a scanner. <i>A brain scan.</i>
<u>skim</u>	Reading or glancing through quickly. <i>There was a thin skim of oil on the water.</i>

Browse as a Verb

Definitions of "Browse" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "browse" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Look around casually and randomly, without seeking anything in particular.*
- *Feed as in a meadow or pasture.*
- *Scan through a text, website, or collection of data to gain an impression of the contents.*
- *(of an animal) feed on leaves, twigs, or other high-growing vegetation.*
- *Survey goods for sale in a leisurely and casual way.*
- *Shop around; not necessarily buying.*

- *Eat lightly, try different dishes.*

graze	Scrape gently. <i>Cattle graze on the open meadows.</i>
have a look	Go through (mental or physical states or experiences).
have a look at	Cause to be born.
look	Look forward to the probable occurrence of. <i>People were looking at him.</i>
look around	Accord in appearance with.
look round	Perceive with attention; direct one's gaze towards.
nibble	Eat frequently in small amounts. <i>He nibbled a biscuit.</i>
pasture	Put animals to graze in a pasture. <i>They pastured their cows in the water meadow.</i>
peruse	Examine or consider with attention and in detail. <i>I perused several online reviews.</i>
range	Place or arrange in a row or rows or in a specified manner. <i>The instruments ranged from tuba to cymbals.</i>
<u>ruminate</u>	(of a ruminant) chew the cud. <i>Cows ruminate.</i>
run one's eye over	Stretch out over a distance, space, time, or scope; run or extend between two points or beyond a certain point.
<u>scan</u>	(of verse) conform to metrical principles. <i>We scanned the beam over a sector of 120.</i>
shop	Visit one or more shops or websites to buy goods. <i>Sometimes it's more convenient to shop online.</i>
<u>skim</u>	Remove from the surface. <i>Bring the stock to the boil then skim it to remove any foam.</i>
surf	Ride the waves of the sea with a surfboard. <i>Surf the internet or the world wide web.</i>
window-shop	Examine the shop windows; shop with the eyes only.

- *She browsed through the newspaper.*
- *They reach upward to browse on bushes.*
- *Browse a computer directory.*
- *I decided to spend the night browsing the internet.*

ask	Require or ask for as a price or condition. <i>Mary asked her father for money.</i>
curious	Eager to investigate and learn or learn more (sometimes about others' concerns). <i>Curious about the neighbor's doings.</i>
deer	Distinguished from Bovidae by the male's having solid deciduous antlers.
eat	Eat a meal take a meal. <i>If we had to we could probably eat the cost.</i>
feed	Feed into supply. <i>I think he is feeding his old employer commercial secrets.</i>

find	Get or find back recover the use of. <i>I can t find my keys.</i>
finger	Touch or feel with the fingers. <i>The thin man fingered his moustache.</i>
fingertip	The end (tip) of a finger. <i>Police made a fingertip search of the area.</i>
forage	The act of searching for food and provisions. <i>The animals forage in the woods.</i>
forefinger	The finger next to the thumb.
fox	The grey or reddish brown fur of a fox. <i>The abbreviation foxed me completely.</i>
goat	A scapegoat. <i>Just for once stop acting the goat.</i>
graze	Feed as in a meadow or pasture. <i>Downland areas grazed by sheep.</i>
grazing	The act of grazing. <i>Large areas of rough grazing.</i>
hitch	Obtain a lift by hitch hiking. <i>She hitched up her skirt and ran.</i>
hunting	The activity of hunting wild animals or game. <i>Whale hunting is unnecessary.</i>
inquiring	A request for information. <i>An open inquiring mind.</i>
look	Look forward to the probable occurrence of. <i>He just didn t look himself at all.</i>
mutton	The flesh of fully grown sheep used as food. <i>A leg of mutton.</i>
pasture	Let feed in a field or pasture or meadow. <i>They pastured their cows in the water meadow.</i>
pig	Live like a pig in squalor. <i>I bet he s scoffed them all greedy pig.</i>
probing	Inquiring closely into something; searching. <i>A probing inquiry.</i>
questioning	The raising of a doubt about or objection to something. <i>Aaron shot her a questioning glance.</i>
searching	Thoroughly scrutinizing, especially in a disconcerting way. <i>You have to ask yourselves some searching questions.</i>

sheep

A docile and vulnerable person who would rather follow than make an independent decision.

*Party members should not follow their leader like **sheep**.*

sow

Place seeds in or on (the ground).

*Catch crops should be **sown** after minimal cultivation.*

thumb

Press move or touch something with one s thumb.

*As soon as she **thumbed** the button the door slid open.*

venison

Meat from a deer used as food.

Venison steaks.

wolf

Used in names of mammals similar or related to the wolf e g maned wolf
Tasmanian wolf.

*The teenager **wolfed** down the pizza.*
